SVDP: "GIVING HELP AND HOPE, ONE PERSON AT A TIME." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835, and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Today at Holy Redeemer our "conference" seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as our food pantry. Currently our pantry has over sixty volunteers, and receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank. Our conference has a board which meets twice a month, and our meetings are open to any interested parishioners (see Other Pantry News, below). Our president is Gordon Oliver oliver.svdp@gmail.com, and our parent organization is the SVDP Portland Council www.svdppdx.org. We have a Board of Directors which meets in the rectory on the second and fourth Tuesdays of every month at 6:30 PM as well as by Zoom. 



Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

Pastor's Message



Dear friends:

"After withdrawing about a stone's throw from them and kneeling, he prayed, saying, 'Father, if you are willing, take this cup away from me; still, not my will but yours be done'. And to strengthen him an angel from heaven appeared to him. He was in such agony and he prayed so fervently that his sweat became like drops of blood falling on the ground." (Luke 22:41-44)

When Jesus decided to finally go to Jerusalem, he must have wondered, being fully human, whether he was up to what he was about to face. He was not fooled by the triumphal entry into Jerusalem. The very people who acclaimed him would soon enough be shouting for his crucifixion. Clearly, he had some foreknowledge that he would be killed like many of the prophets before him. Still, he could not know exactly how all of this would transpire.

The first mystery of the Sorrowful Mysteries of the rosary is "The Agony in the Garden." We are privileged in this Sunday's gospel reading from Luke to be present with Jesus when his most trusted disciples are asleep. He is in profound emotional agony and his sweat is described as falling likes drops of blood to the earth. As he wrestles with his pending death, he wonders if he will have the strength to endure it. Three times he begs to have this cup of suffering removed from him, but always ends by insisting that not his will but the Father's will be done.

I take such great comfort from seeing how fully human Jesus was. Like him, all of us have faced seasons of fear and uncertainty when we were not sure we could handle the situation before us. Perhaps we were not sure we had the ability to take on a new and serious responsibility. Whenever we are confronted by a situation which seems beyond our strength to bear, we enter into the same agony that Jesus felt in Gethsemane.

Luke says that an angel of heaven appeared to Jesus to comfort him. When we feel overwhelmed by life, and feel as if God has abandoned us and our friends seems far away, Christ himself is with us. I can think of hard times in my life where I felt weak and overwhelmed by life. It was then that I really learned to pray. God somehow sustained me and helped me come out the other side.

Whatever our trials or struggles, we can turn to Christ who will never fail us nor forsake us. He is as close as our heartbeat and our breathing. We can take him within us at Communion. He is in the eyes of all who love us and pray for us.

May we be Christ for all who find themselves alone and afraid.

These lines from "The Servant Song" have always brought me peace and comfort:

I will hold the Christ-light for you In the night time of your fear. I will hold my hand out to you; Speak the peace you long to hear. I will weep when you are weeping. When you laugh, I'll laugh with you. I will share your joy and sorrow Till we've seen this journey through.
