HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE:

"Giving help and hope, etc...." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our "conference" at

Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry. Our pantry, with over sixty volunteers, receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and the Nite Hawk restaurant. We have a Board which meets twice a month, and our parent organization is the Portland District Council www.svdppdx.org. Meetings take place in the Rectory on the second and fourth Tuesdays of every month at 6:30 PM, and by Zoom (for the link: svdpsecretary@holyredeemerpdx.org). LAUDATO SI, CIRCLE SMALL GROUPS Holy Redeemer is excited to announce new small groups in the parish, a Laudato Si Circle. Pastor's Message

Brothers and Sisters.

Happy 2nd Sunday of Easter and a Blessed Divine Mercy Sunday! As we see emblazoned in our sanctuary: **"With the Lord, there is mercy and fullness of redemption!"** (Psalm 130:7). These 50 days of Easter are absolute joy for us! God shows us unending mercy through the gift of our Holy Redeemer, Jesus Christ risen from the dead, God's only- begotten Son. **Alleluia!**

Every Sunday and every Sunday of Easter are times we reflect upon God's mercy. However, Pope Saint John Paul II, given his Polish heritage, designated the 2nd Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday through his devotion to St. Faustina. She experienced the Lord's mercy in her communion with the Lord and what she received privately. Through her, we have the Divine Mercy chaplet and novena which have become popular devotions. **Praise God!**

Another experience of God's mercy is our happiness for Rev. Mr. Cameron Cortens, CSC, who was ordained to the priesthood at the Basilica of the Sacred Heart of Jesus at the University of Notre Dame, the American hub of the Priests and Brothers of the Congregation of Holy Cross. On Saturday, April 23, three young Holy Cross religious were ordained to the priesthood by the Bishop of Fort Wayne-South Bend, Indiana, by the Most Rev. Kevin Rhodes. **Thank you, Jesus!**

About 30 parishioners traveled to Notre Dame for this celebration and many of us here in Portland were able to watch the ordination liturgy on livestream. **Deacon Cameron** now is **Father Cameron**. He will continue to live out his Baptism as a religious of the Congregation of Holy Cross, but now he gives his life, his love and his energy in service to the People of God, the Church, through his teaching, his preaching and his sacramental ministry.

It is an exciting time for him and for all of us who know him. Upon his return, Fr. Cameron will offer two Masses of Thanksgiving at Holy Redeemer: an English Mass on Sunday, May 1, at 10:00 am, with a reception following in Cantwell Hall; and a Spanish Mass on Sunday, May 8, at Noon, with a reception following in Cantwell Hall. Everyone is invited!

Another experience of God's grace is for all the adults who received Baptism, Confirmation, and received the Eucharist at the Holy Saturday Easter Vigil, those at parishes throughout our Archdiocese and throughout the world. The mercy of God is seen in the new Christians who are among us. **Alleluia!**

Also, God's mercy is seen in the children who will receive First Communion, both at the English and Spanish Masses, in the upcoming months. **Praise God!**

And God's mercy is evident when many young people from Holy Redeemer and four of our NE Vicariate parishes will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on Friday, April 29, at Holy Redeemer Church with Archbishop Sample. **Thank you, Jesus!**
