

Pastor's Message

Dear Friends:

Hopefully you saw the good news via Flocknote that we will be receiving a new deacon here at Holy Redeemer Parish! His name is Cameron Cortens, C.S.C., and like my mother, hails from the Great State of Idaho. He grew up in Boise, Idaho, and is the eldest of four children. He received his B.A. from Notre Dame in philosophy and theology, and will graduate from Notre Dame for the second time this May, when he will receive his Master of Divinity degree.

After finishing his undergraduate studies, Cameron participated in the House of Brigid program in Wexford, Ireland. Founded in 2009 as an initiative of the University of Notre Dame Folk Choir, its mission stems from a spirit of gratitude to the missionaries of Ireland who brought the Catholic faith to America, an effort to strengthen in today's Irish Catholics the faith that sustained their ancestors, and a desire to give young Americans the opportunity to immerse themselves in Irish culture and Celtic spirituality.

Members live as an intentional lay community for one year and serve in a variety of liturgical and catechetical responsibilities at parishes with schools. They plan Masses, direct choirs, support the catechesis of school children and adults, prepare and offer retreats, and bring their ministry to the greater Irish Church through workshops and radio programs.

After his time with the House of Brigid, Cameron entered Moreau Seminary at Notre Dame. While in the midst of his seminary formation, he lived and served for one year at Nuestra Madre Santísima de la Luz Parish in Guadalupe, Nuevo León, in Mexico. He is fluent in Spanish and has a great love for Mexico and its people.

Cameron has a passion for music and is a gifted vocalist, as well as an accomplished piano and guitar player. I can only imagine that with his love of Ireland and of Mexico, we will benefit in a particular way from his musical talents on March 17th, when we honor St. Patrick, and on December 12th, when we honor Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Cameron will profess his perpetual vows and be ordained to the diaconate in August of this year at the Basilica of the Sacred Heart at Notre Dame.

It is always exciting to welcome a new deacon to a parish. I will never forget my first year as a deacon at St. John Vianney Parish in Goodyear, Arizona, when Fr. Joe Corpora was just beginning as Pastor there. Your first parish placement as a deacon is always one that you treasure and never forget. I know that Holy Redeemer will be a great placement for him because of all of you.

Please pray for Cameron as prepares for his perpetual profession of vows and ordination to the diaconate. May his time with us at Holy Redeemer be truly blessed in every way!
