HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian

enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council <u>www.svdppdx.org</u>. CONFIRMATION REGISTRATION

Our parish is now ready to start receiving registrations for our two-year confirmation program, which will begin in the fall. Families of teens going into the 8th grade and older are invited to fill out registration forms either in the parish office during weekday office hours or on our parish website at <u>https://holyredeemerpdxchurch.org/</u> <u>confirmation-1</u>. **September 2nd is the deadline for registration**. Confirmation candidates will typically meet from 2-3:30pm on Sundays throughout the academic year, beginning on September 11th.





Fr. Pat's Message



Dear Friends:

I continue to admire Pope Francis, who despite his age and health issues that affect his mobility, continues to travel the globe, and who always seems to offer powerfully prophetic critiques on a host of issues affecting the common good.

Pope Francis often directs messages to young people, much like John Paul II did years ago. He just met with participants in an Italian youth camp on August 5 at the Vatican. Pope Francis told the young Catholics in attendance that Jesus is not just a moral precept but a person and a great friend. He encouraged them to build and cultivate their relationship with Christ as Blessed Carlo Acutis did.

Carlo Acutis was the first millennial to be beatified by the Catholic Church. Pope Francis pointed out that Acutis loved the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. "To be always united with Jesus, this is my life program," he wrote at age 7.

He also reminded the young people present of the message from Christus Vivit, a postsynodal exhortation published in 2019 in which he wrote, "Christ is alive and he wants you to be alive!"

I think that all of us are concerned with a growing disconnect between young people in our country and traditional religion. Even at Holy Redeemer, it is a challenge to keep our young people connected with the practice of their Catholic faith once they graduate from our school or receive Confirmation. Pope Francis reminds us of the need to invest energy in helping young people to encounter the person of Christ, especially through the Eucharist and through personal prayer.

As you know, we are seeking to offer a two-year Confirmation Program to help young people experience more deeply the person of Christ and the riches of the Catholic faith on a deeper level. We are also in the process of forming a new youth group. What we sorely lack are mentors who would be willing to commit some of their time to serve our youth in these programs. So if you ever feel moved by the Spirit to take a more active interest in accompanying our young people, let me know!

Please remember our young people in your prayers. There is no greater gift they can receive than to experience the presence of Christ, especially in the Eucharist. May the Holy Spirit touch the minds and hearts of our young people, so that they, too, can build and cultivate their relationship with Christ.
