

ASK FOR HELP: CLEAN FOOD PANTRY

This crew could be one person, or a couple of people working together. Do you need a family centered service project? This could be it.

The goal of the Clean Up Crew is to assure the Food Pantry facility is thoroughly cleaned on a scheduled basis.

Weekly Cleaning includes:

- Bathroom clean sink, counter and the toilet and mop floor.
- Clean all flat surfaces throughout the Pantry.
- Flatten Cardboard and take to onsite recycling.

Monthly Cleaning includes:

- Sweep under all shelving units and refrigerators.
- Vacuum floor mats & mop all floors.
- Inform Pantry managers when cleaning supplies are low.

Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

I always laugh when Jesus invites his disciples to come away to a place apart to rest awhile and every time they get there, the crowds arrived before them. It never seemed to happen.

I was blessed to have my annual retreat last week. It always takes a day or two to slow down, to rest, and get into the spirit of the retreat. Initially it is hard to put aside the smart phone and the email and get into 'airplane mode.'

What I am most aware of on retreat is the endless chatter of my mind. As the years pass, I realize more and more that what makes for inner unhappiness and fear is the constant commentary of the human mind. How rarely is it still. How rarely does the peace of Christ prevail when the mind is in overdrive.

It is in the stillness that Christ is always present. While part of me would welcome the clear sign, the dramatic insight that suddenly puts all interior anxiety at an end, Christ does not usually act that way. It is more an inner knowing that I am loved by him, called by him, sustained by him, and guided by him. My life is unfolding exactly as it should. I am simply invited to be still and to trust in His love.

The challenge for us modern folk is to find little moments of retreat throughout our very busy days. We are surrounded by constant noise and distractions and our phones and computers ping all day long clamoring for our immediate attention and action. We never get everything done on our to-do list. Life today makes endless demands upon us and so often we feel spent and tired.

What are those daily islands of stillness for you? What makes you more aware of Christ in the people and events of your daily life? What helps you to slow down and be present to the moment, which is all we really have anyway?

I do encourage any of you who feel so inclined to consider a directed retreat experience of a weekend or longer at some point. You will never be sorry and your family will probably thank you for it. It will connect you more deeply to the source of life, Jesus Christ, to your loved ones, and remind you of your call and vocation in this world.

In the meantime, we can find ways each day to slow down, to breathe, to be present to the moment, and to follow the wisdom of the psalmist: "Be still and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10).
