EMERGENCY FOOD ASSISTANCE

Our SVDP Food Room is open Wednesdays and Saturdays 2:30-4:30pm. Anyone in need of emergency food is encouraged to visit; all requests are treated confidentially. Another resource is Oregonfoodfinder.org.

FOOD PANTRY NEEDS: empty dozen egg boxes, garden produce and jelly. You can bring these to the rectory or to the Food Room during Wednesday & Saturday hours.

ASK FOR HELP: CLEAN FOOD PANTRY

This crew could be one person, or a couple of people working together. Do you need a family centered service project? This could be it.

The goal of the Clean Up Crew is to assure the Food Pantry facility is thoroughly cleaned on a scheduled basis.

Weekly Cleaning includes:

- Bathroom clean sink, counter and the toilet and mop floor.
- Clean all flat surfaces throughout the Pantry.
- Flatten Cardboard and take to onsite recycling.

Monthly Cleaning includes:

- Sweep under all shelving units and refrigerators.
- Vacuum floor mats & mop all floors.
- Inform Pantry managers when cleaning supplies are low.

Pastor's Message



As you know, Cameron Cortens, C.S.C., will be making his profession of perpetual vows on Saturday, August 28, in the Basilica of the

Sacred Heart at Notre Dame, and will be ordained to the diaconate in the chapel at Moreau Seminary on Sunday, August 29. I feel blessed that I will be present for this important moment for Cameron and his classmates.

It is hard to describe the moment when you kneel at the Basilica before the Provincial Superior and profess forever the vows of chastity, poverty, and obedience. Though I know that any of you who have professed your wedding vows understand how radical it is to promise to another human being, and to God, that you will strive to be faithful forever.

I thought I might share with you some wisdom from the Constitutions of the Congregation of Holy Cross on spirituality that underpins the professing of vows.

We profess our vows in a moment, but living them for the sake of the kingdom is the work of a lifetime. That fulfillment demands more from us than the mere wish, more even than the firm decision. It demands the conversion of our habits, our character, our attitudes, our desires (Constitution 6, para. 57).

The journey begins with our profession and ends only at our resurrection. We would be created anew to the point where we would say, "It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me." It is the Lord who gives us both the desire and the accomplishment. For our part we must submit to the wisdom and the discipline that will purify us of our selfishness and will make us wholehearted in the service of his people (Constitution 6, para. 59).

I made my perpetual profession of vows and was ordained to the diaconate in early September of 1990. It has been an amazing journey thus far and I would do it over again in a heartbeat. The blessings I have received since joining Holy Cross have far exceeded the sad and difficult moments. Yet I have since learned that it is precisely the sad and difficult moments that lead to personal conversion and growth. Moreover, I have had some amazing traveling companions in Holy Cross who are true brothers and friends to me.

I am sure that all of you will join me in praying for Cameron in a special way as he prepares for this important milestone in his life. May his years of life and service in Holy Cross be richly blessed by God and fruitful in every way. We are indeed blessed to have him with us and I suspect that he will look back on his time with us at Holy Redeemer with great fondness.

May God continue to bless the Congregation of Holy Cross with young men like Cameron and his classmates to serve the needs of the Church and the world.
