



Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

When I was a boy in 1st grade at St. Joseph's Grade School in La Porte, Indiana, I would walk the 10 blocks to school each morning and attend Mass before school began. The wonderful Franciscan sisters who taught us

were always there, as well as the daily Mass faithful, mostly older women who caused the universe to shift in response to their constant prayers!

It recently occurred to me that I was 7 years old then and now I'm 57, which means for 50 years the Mass has been a constant in my life. Little did I dream then that I would be privileged to preside at Mass as a priest. There is hardly a greater treasure in my life, or a more ready source of peace and consolation.

Of course, we humans can take anything we love for granted, even the Mass. Then along comes this pandemic which turns our whole world upside down. Suddenly the things that make up our normal routine came to a grinding halt, including weekday and Sunday Masses.

For good reason the Church refers to the Eucharist as the source and summit of our lives. We know now, better than ever, that in order to enter fully into the mystery of this saving meal and sacrifice, one needs to be physically present. The same Christ who gave his body and blood to the disciples at the Last Supper does the same for us at every Mass. It can't happen virtually, though even being able to watch it from afar still keeps us connected to it.

Thankfully, Governor Brown's current directives allow us to have 50 people present for each Mass. While those who are at higher risk because of age or preexisting conditions should still not come to Mass, we encourage you to come with your families if you are able. We continue to follow all the required protocols on distancing, the wearing of masks, and sanitizing the church after each liturgy. Recently we were directed to have our musicians start wearing masks. Only the lector while reading does not have to.

We have all missed regular contact with family members and friends during this pandemic, but also with our Holy Redeemer family of faith. We are, after all, the body of Christ, and brothers and sisters of one another. Know that Fr. Michael and I truly miss seeing you on a regular basis. We look forward to the day when a vaccine is at last available, and we can all pray together, side by side, with joy in our hearts for the gift of Christ in the Eucharist and the gift of one another.
