Fr. Paul's Message



I failed at my first job. I had a very simple task. I was to take samples of wood finishes that the furniture factory produced and place them onto a wood board with labels so that an interior decorator could choose the look of their custom furniture or show those samples to their clients so they could choose the wood finish they preferred for their custom furniture. People would pay thousands of dollars for the furniture we produced. It was beyond sturdy and could be transformed to meet any need or color palate. This furniture company was a family company, run by a group of brothers who had inherited it from their father. I was hired by the sister of a dear friend had worked with the family for decades. I was treated like family and told that my work, although small, was essential to the success of the company. I failed.

I sent out a sample board with incorrect labeling. The interior decorator called the office and let the brothers know. I was called into a board room with all the heads of the departments along with the brothers. I was asked what happened to the sample board, why was it put together incorrectly? I blamed my friend, my coworker, the one who's sister got me the job. He was brought into the board room as well. He asked when it was shipped out, from that date we were able to discern that it was my fault. We were told to not let it happen again. My friend said nothing to me, was not angry. My bosses, the brothers, did not fire me, I could continue working there. My friend's sister treated me like a brother still. But I had seen a dark side of my character, I lied to people who trusted me, whose livelihood depended on my work.

I have come to realize that we are all responsible for the Kingdom of Heaven.

Yes, St. Peter plays a special part, as does the Pope in teaching and upholding the work of God, His Grace, the presence of Christ in the sacraments of the Church. However, I do have a part to play. I too am called to sainthood. I am my brother's keeper. My word is a reflection of the Incarnate Word in my life.

I have learned the value of integrity, and that if my Lord God is merciful and loving, willing to die to save the lives of others, that I too, His servant, must be merciful and loving, willing to lay down my life to save others. It is not enough to say that I am Christian. I must radiate that truth in all that I do and speak. I believe I have been forgiven, saved really, but that I must continue to participate in that reality each and every day, that faith without integrity is really nothing at all.
