



## HOLY REDEEMER SVDP CONFERENCE





Our SVDP Food Room is open Wednesdays and Saturdays 2:30-4:00pm. Anyone in need of emergency food is encouraged to visit us there for assistance; all requests are treated confidentially.

Holy Redeemer's St. Vincent de Paul conference is best known for our twice-weekly food pantry and distribution of Christmas food boxes. Less known is our assistance to those in need of help with rent and utilities.

We currently are able to provide emergency rent and utility assistance—to persons who are facing utility cutoff or eviction. Last year we paid over \$30,000 for this purpose. We currently offer up to \$500 in rent and \$300 in utility assistance to help individuals or families, limited to once a year. Assistance is provided to persons/households within our parish boundaries (N. Alberta to the Columbia River and N. Denver to NE 26th Ave.) We are able to provide this assistance thanks to the generosity of parishioners, and recently with additional funds from a grant from the Oregon Community Foundation.

If you or someone you know within parish boundaries are facing utility cutoff or eviction, please call the SVDP District office at 503-235-8431 and request emergency assistance. Your request will be reviewed and forward to our conference. All requests are treated confidentially.

## **Pastor's Message**



Dear Friends:

I feel blessed that I was able to preside at our two Confirmation Masses this past Wednesday and Friday. Usually the only time a Pastor can confirm someone is at the Easter Vigil, but because of Covid-19, the Archbishop granted faculties to Pastors to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation at our parishes ourselves. I'm trying not to let this

newfound faculty to confirm others to go to my head. Besides, this permission expires on December 31, 2020!

I remember when I was a young priest at our parish in Arizona and Fr. Joe Corpora confirmed those who were baptized and received into the Church at the Easter Vigil. I was the Director of the R.C.I.A. program that year, and after the Easter Vigil we had a chance to reflect on the experience with the group. I remember one woman who said something astounding. She simply stated: "I now know who the Holy Spirit is. I felt the Holy Spirit the moment the chrism oil was applied to my forehead." I was blown away, to say the least.

I have always had an interest in the ways that people experience the presence of the Holy Spirit. For a long time I thought that a special anointing of the Holy Spirit would resolve all of my problems and make life become smooth and trouble-free. Now I know that this expectation was unrealistic.

Of course, the apostles are the prime example of what can happen when one receives the Holy Spirit. These ordinary, fearful, cowardly men suddenly became filled with confidence, boldness, and inner joy. They began to manifest the same powers to heal as Jesus did. And they willfully laid down their lives for Christ. But they remained human and vulnerable, too.

I am more and more convinced that the Holy Spirit, given to us at baptism and confirmation, is a loving, wise, gentle presence who is constantly at work within us to transform us. We are not suddenly going to be lifted out of our problems, weaknesses, or struggles. These are precisely the things that the Holy Spirit is going to transform into a blessing for us. And perhaps the real transformation is simply accepting my life situation as it is. That acceptance brings with it an inner peace and joy, despite the problems on the surface of my life. I finally know that I am loved by Christ and that all is well because he holds me close to himself.

In the end, to become a saint is to become who God created me to be. No saint was perfect or without imperfections. They suffered terrible trials at times. The saints simply accepted that they were greatly loved as they were and their whole lives became a response to that love.

My prayer for you, and for those just confirmed, is that the Holy Spirit can be a felt presence in your life, giving you inner light, peace, and joy, as you discover who you are in God's eyes.
