

Fr. Paul's Message







Saint John the Baptist, a great Advent figure, announces to us every year the proximity of the Lord. That is why he invites us to conversion. Conversion is the basic condition of a sincere faith, the starting point of any religious renewal, and the best preparation for the joy of Christmas.

What is conversion?

It is a profound, total change that encompasses the whole person; a change of mentality, an inner change - that leads us to transform our entire outer life as well. It is a return, a definitive opening to God and others.

In the life of every Christian, there is a first conversion: on the day of our Baptism we are converted, by the grace and strength of God, into new, redeemed beings, children of God.

In every Christian's life, there should also be a second conversion: to realize that being a Christian is more than living Christian customs and routines. Making the personal decision for a Christian life, a deliverance of one's self to God and others, becoming generous to all, committed - but by conviction, not just by tradition.

Sometimes we have an overly simplistic concept of conversion: moving from a situation of atheism to faith, or from a moral corruption to a righteous life.

There are conversions of this kind: a radical change of direction, the choice of a new life—for instance, the conversion of Saint Paul, Saint Augustine, and Saint Francis. We can even say that the history of the Church is the history of its conversions and renovations, the history of its great converts. Also, in our present times, there are ecclesial movements that have produced many conversions.

But there is also another form of conversion, a more common and general form: they are men and women who do not make such spectacular turns. They are people who constantly show up, and are ever present for God and others. Every year they are seen as more generous, cheerful, more profound in their wisdom and service to others. They are the women and men of small conversions, of daily conversions.

If we want to say it through an image: the conversion is like a FIRE. Today's Gospel says: "He will baptize you with fire." And there is also that word of Jesus: "I came to bring fire to the earth" (Luke 12:49). All concerts have been drawn to that fire of Jesus: for some, it is like a fire that seems to suddenly burn them and everything changes ... For others - without doubt, the

great majority - the fire is interior, discreet, slow, but constant. A fire that lights, burns, heats. A fire that permanently revives and spreads ...

Now, what are the fruits of this constant conversion?

- Marian apparitions. For instance, the celebration of our Lady of Guadalupe this week, a conversion of an entire nation, Mexico.
- Families that are open and available to God, families that are committed and supportive towards their brothers and sisters in Christ.

Proof of the effectiveness of this grace of transformation is ourselves.

Dear brothers and sisters, let us ask Mary and Jesus to awaken in us, more and more, the desire to change. May they give us the grace of permanent transformation - so that this time of Advent prepares us and opens us up for the great irruption of God in the miracle of Christmas, the Incarnation of Christ.
