

### HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE



"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility

assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council <u>www.svdppdx.org</u>. ### YOUTH GROUP ON DECEMBER 18TH AT 1:30PM- DRESS WARMLY!



## Fr. Pat's Message



Dear Friends:

During Advent we often sing the hymn, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel." The song is based on the O Antiphons which were drawn from the Book of the prophet Isaiah and composed in the sixth or seventh century. Since ancient times, the seven O Antiphons are chanted or recited during Vespers in the days leading up to Christmas, beginning on December 17.

Bishop Michael D. Pfeifer, a bishop emeritus of San Angelo, Texas, discovered an interesting secret about the O Antiphons which I had never heard before. He wrote that the first letters of each antiphon form the Latin word SARCORE, which read backwards is ERO CRAS, which means 'Tomorrow I come."

Here is the pattern he discovered:

- December 17 "O Sapientia"/"O Wisdom" (Isaiah 11:2-3; 28:29)
- December 18 "O Adonai"/"O Lord" (Isaiah 11:4-5; 33:22)
- December 19 "O Radix Jesse"/"O Root of Jesse" (Isaiah 11:1; 11:10)
- December 20 "O Clavis David"/"O Key of David" (Isaiah 9:6; 22:22)
- December 21 "O **O**riens"/"O Dawn of the East" (Isaiah 9:2)
- December 22 "O Rex Gentiu"/"O King of the Gentiles" (Isaiah 2:4; 9:7)
- December 23 "O Emmanuel"/"God with Us" (Isaiah 7:14)

Together, these antiphons spell out "a hopeful message about the coming of the long-awaited Messiah, of Jesus as we prepare for his birthday each year on December 25," Bishop Pfeifer said. He went on to explain why they end on December 23. "Traditionally feasts were said to begin on the eve of their celebration, so Christmas begins at sundown on December 24," he wrote.

"Each Christmas Jesus fulfills the promise 'I will come tomorrow' by being born again as a tiny baby, the Godman, Jesus Christ," he wrote. "We can make the following O Antiphons part of our Advent preparation for the birth of Christ by using them in our prayers or Advent scriptural readings."

He added: "Then in gratitude and joy we celebrate the birth of our long-awaited savior, Jesus Christ — Christmas."

What I also appreciated was his pastoral message around all of this. It was simply: 'Don't forget the baby!" He suggests that the first thing we should think about is what gift the baby Jesus wants to give us. The second thing is that we figure out what we find in our hearts that we want to give the baby Jesus.

I think of the little drummer boy who had no gift to bring the child king but decided to play his drum for him and played his best for him. Then the child king smiled at him.

Are we any different from the little drummer boy? What shall we give him this Christmas?
