## HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE DO YOU HAVE ENOUGH HEALTHY FOOD FOR YOURSELF AND YOUR FAMILY?

If you are struggling, you are not alone. We can help you get through difficult times with nutritious fresh and canned food from our St. Vincent de Paul food pantry. Located in the church basement off Williams Avenue, we are open Wednesdays and Saturdays from 2:30 to 4:00 pm. All requests are treated confidentially. Please bring your donations to the church on Saturday or Sunday, to the rectory during office hours (8 a.m. to 3 p.m.), or drop by during pantry hours of 2:30 to 4 pm Wednesdays and Saturdays. Please specify that the donations are for the Christmas food baskets. Thanks for your generosity.

<u>FOOD PANTRY NEEDS</u>: Pancake mix, jam, coffee, tea, and empty one-dozen egg cartons. You can bring these to the rectory or to the Food Room during Wednesday & Saturday hours.

<u>SOCK DRIVE</u>: Again, this year we will be collecting socks for the homeless. There will be a barrel in the entrance to the church for your donation. **RENT & UTILITY ASSISTANCE:** We are able to provide emergency rent and utility assistance-for those facing utility cutoff or eviction. Assistance is provided to registered parishioners and households within our parish boundaries (N. Ainsworth/ N. Killingsworth to the Columbia River and MLK to NE 22nd Ave.). ### **HOLY DAY DONATIONS USING EFT:**





# Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

When I preached at the Mass for Our Lady of Guadalupe last year, I made reference to the Harry Potter series, when several people, including Prof. Lupin and Prof. Snape, say to Harry, "You have your mother's eyes." I said to those present, "Today I can say to all of you blessed to be of Mexican descent, 'You have your mother's eyes,' for Our Lady of Guadalupe is your mother."

She chose to appear in Mexico to their ancestors, namely to Juan Diego, a simple, indigenous farmer. She showed them, and showed all of us, the feminine face of

God. And for most of their families, their *abuelitas* (grandmothers) have been pillars of faith, showing them the feminine face of God: one that is loving, patient, consoling, strengthening, believing, sacrificing, serving, forgiving, and unifying.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, known as *La Morenita*, (the dark-skinned one) also represents a mixture of the cultures which blended to form Mexico, both racially and religiously. She is also referred to as "the first Mexican," bringing together people of distinct cultural heritages, while at the same time affirming their distinctiveness.

In my mind, *La Morenita* is more relevant than ever, as we seek to overcome racial divisions in our nation and strive to bring together people of many races and diverse cultural traditions.

How blessed have I been to have lived in Mexico, Chile, Kenya, and Uganda. I learned that our Catholic family is very large, and that we have brothers and sisters in every land. Their skin color, their languages, their food, their music and dances, are all unique and beautiful. Imagine being at the Basilica of Guadalupe today to see the diversity of her people and the beauty of their faith on display.

I believe that God delights in our amazing human diversity. Far from separating us as Americans, our diversity should be seen as a gift to be honored, affirmed, and celebrated. Racism is simply human blindness. For we are all one in God.

In the tilma (tunic) of Juan Diego, where Our Lady of Guadalupe's image is still miraculously preserved to this day, Mary's eyes are looking downwards towards Jesus her Son. She is inviting us to draw closer to her Son, and he will enlighten us, end our sadness, and fill us with his peace. He will make us a light to his people.

Our Lady of Guadalupe has no eyes but yours. You have your mother's eyes. Christ has no eyes now but yours. You have Christ's eyes. Your eyes must look out upon the people of this world with love and compassion, with mercy and with tenderness.

Today our eyes turn towards Mexico and we join the many pilgrims in Mexico City to honor *La Virgencita*, Mother and Queen of Mexico and the Mother of the Americas. May she intercede for us, that we may see everything with her eyes of faith.

And as Mass is celebrated at her Basilica in Mexico City, and here at Holy Redeemer, and we receive the sacred host from the altar—which is Christ himself—we are one in his body. Christ looks at us and we look at him in the host. And Our Lady of Guadalupe, our Mother, smiles with her loving eyes upon us all, just as she did with Juan Diego.
