NEW MASS ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES

Governor Brown announced new coronavirus guidelines on November 25, 2020, which took effect on Wednesday, December 2. With our current capacity and physical distancing requirements, we will be able to accommodate up to 22 groups of people, not to exceed 100 people total per Mass.

HOLY REDEEMER SVDP CONFERENCE

We have openings for Wednesday 2:15-4:15 in the HR Food Pantry in the basement of the church. Volunteers work 2 hours once every four weeks. During the COVID emergency, only Volunteers work in the pantry, packing boxes to give out to clients and their families. All Volunteers are wearing masks and using gloves. This is a great opportunity for HR Parents to earn Fair Share Hours. Commitment is 2 hours every 4 weeks. Most Volunteers say that they receive much more than they give from their involvement in this ministry. RENT & UTILITY ASSISTANCE

We are able to provide emergency rent and utility assistance-for those facing utility cutoff or eviction. Assistance is provided to registered parishioners and households within our parish boundaries (N. Alberta to the Columbia River and N. Denver to NE 26th Ave.). We are able to provide this assistance due to the generosity of parishioners. The Oregon Community Foundation grant program is closed at this time.

EMERGENCY FOOD ASSISTANCE

HR's SVDP Food Room (back side of church, basement level) is open every Wednesday and Saturday, 2:30 -4:00 PM. Anyone in need of emergency food is encouraged to go to the food room during these hours of operation to be given emergency food. All requests are treated confidentially. Dear Friends:

Probably the most formative chapter in my life was the spring semester I spent in Mexico City in 1983 while an undergraduate at Notre Dame. I lived with a wonderful Mexican family and was introduced to a culture wholly different than anything I had

ever known. In short order, I fell in love with Mexico, her people, her food, and all her beautiful customs and traditions. When I was taken to the shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe, and saw her image on the enshrined *tilma* (cloak) of Juan Diego in the cathedral, I understood that her appearance was the core religious event and symbol of this profoundly Catholic nation. I later learned that the shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe is the most visited Catholic pilgrimage destination in the world.

It all began in 1531, not long after the Spanish conquest of Mexico, when Our Lady of Guadalupe made multiple appearances to Juan Diego and spoke to him in his native Nahuatl. She asked him to see the Bishop and to request that a shrine be built on the site of her appearances. Naturally skeptical, the Bishop insisted that he needed a sign. She then instructed Juan Diego to pick the roses on the hillside at Tepeyac and carry them in his *tilma* to the Bishop's residence. Unbeknownst to Juan Diego, the roses he picked were Castilian roses that do not grow in Mexico, but in the Bishop's home region of Castile in Spain. When he opened his *tilma* in the Bishop's presence, and the roses fell to the ground, the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe had been imprinted on his cloak.

Our Lady of Guadalupe is known as "la morenita," "the brown woman," who represents a mixture of the cultures which blended to form Mexico, both racially and religiously. She is also referred to as "the first Mexican," bringing together people of distinct cultural heritages, while at the same time affirming their distinctness.

The author Judy King asserts that, "The Virgin of Guadalupe is the rubber band that binds this disparate nation into a whole." Nobel Literature laureate Octavio Paz wrote in 1974 that "The Mexican people, after more than two centuries of experiments and defeats, have faith only in the Virgin of Guadalupe and the National Lottery." Octavio Paz is perhaps on to something!

The Virgin of Guadalupe is considered the Patroness of Mexico and the Continental Americas. Her feast day is December 12, which we just celebrated here at Holy Redeemer.

In my mind, "la morenita" is more relevant than ever, as we seek to overcome racial divisions in our nation and strive to bring together people of many races and diverse cultural traditions. I believe that God delights in our amazing human diversity. Far from separating us as Americans, our diversity should be seen as a gift to be honored, affirmed, and celebrated.

¡Que Viva la Virgen de Guadalupe! Long live Our Lady of Guadalupe! Pray for us!
