

#### **NEW MASS ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES**

Governor Brown announced new coronavirus guidelines on November 25. Faith institutions will be limited to a maximum of 25% capacity or 100 people indoors. With our current capacity and physical distancing requirements, we will be able to accommodate up to 22 groups of people, not to exceed 100 people total per Mass.

#### COVID19

Until further notice only clergy will distribute the Eucharist at Mass. No Precious Blood will be distributed until further notice. Face coverings need to cover both your mouth and nose when you come to Holy Redeemer for Mass or church meetings.

#### HOLY REDEEMER SVDP CONFERENCE

Holy Redeemer parish Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul: As of 12/09/2020, we've served 19 families with \$2,305 in food. Holy Redeemer church/school donated 493 lbs of food and volunteers offered 36 hours of time. Thank you for your ongoing love and sacrifices.

#### SVDP FOOD PANTRY VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

We have openings for Wednesday 2:15-4:15 in the HR Food Pantry in the basement of the church. volunteers work 2 hours once every four weeks. During the COVID emergency, only Volunteers work in the pantry, packing boxes to give out to clients and their families. All volunteers are wearing masks and using gloves. This is a great opportunity for HR Parents to earn Fair Share Hours. Commitment is 2 hours every 4 weeks. Most volunteers say that they receive much more than they give from their involvement in this ministry. #### **RENT & UTILITY ASSISTANCE**

We are able to provide emergency rent and utility assistance-for those facing utility cutoff or eviction. Assistance is provided to registered parishioners and households within our parish boundaries (N. Alberta to the Columbia River and N. Denver to NE 26th Ave.). We are able to provide this assistance due to the generosity of parishioners. The Oregon Community Foundation grant program is closed at this time.

#### **EMERGENCY FOOD ASSISTANCE**

HR's SVDP Food Room (back side of church, basement level) is open every Wednesday and Saturday, 2:30 - 4:00 PM. Anyone in need of emergency food is encouraged to go to the food room during these hours of operation to be given emergency food. All requests are treated confidentially. All visitors must wear masks. SVDP PANTRY NEEDS: Fresh eggs, canned meals/meats/tuna, peanut butter, jelly, cereal & fresh fruits. Please drop them off in the parish office. *Thank you for your help*.



# Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

Today is your special day, the Feast of the Holy Family!

But maybe you're thinking: I love my family, but I wouldn't describe it as particularly holy. I mean, we have our struggles and differences like any other family. We're just normal.

I suspect that if we were in the home at Nazareth, we would have quickly realized how normal family life was for Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Most days involved preparing meals, eating together, talking, washing dishes, doing the laundry, working in the carpentry shop, socializing with family and friends, and going to the synagogue. Jesus spent thirty years at home and only three years in his public ministry. He was incredibly ordinary most of his life.

This should remind us that holiness is mostly found in the ordinary, everyday things of daily family life. It's realizing that washing dishes, heading to work, sharing a meal, helping our children with their on-line homework, watching a movie together, praying with our kids before they go to sleep—all of these things are holy, if I'm consciously present to them.

It's also about doing little things for our families with great love. As Mother Teresa once said, "In this life we cannot do great things. We can only do small things with great love."

We would also be naïve if we thought that the Holy Family didn't have any problems. How about Mary getting pregnant before she and Joseph lived together? How about Mary and Joseph in a panic when they left Jerusalem and couldn't find their young son anywhere?

Most poignant for me would be the death of Joseph and how it must have affected Mary and Jesus. In my home parish there is a beautiful mural of the death of Joseph on the ceiling of our church. Joseph is in bed, nearing the end, and Mary and Jesus are lovingly at his side.

My father wouldn't allow us to stare up at it during Mass, but on the rare occasion when we could sit in the choir loft, I couldn't take my eyes off of it. It was so clear to me that not even the Holy Family could escape pain and loss in their lives at Nazareth.

So our families, too, will experience loss, hardships, separation, and misunderstandings at times. But they will also experience moments of joy, humor, forgivingness, and celebration.

More and more I think that holiness is simply seeing that, because God created the world, and God became a human being in Jesus, just being an ordinary human being in an ordinary human family is something incredibly holy. It is the ordinary path to sainthood for most of us.

May God bless your holy family in a special way this day!
