

HOLY REDEEMER SVDP CONFERENCE

For the week of November 25th we served 19 families with \$2,075 in food. Holy Redeemer church/school volunteers offered 38 hours of time. Thank you for your ongoing love and sacrifice.

RENT & UTILITY ASSISTANCE

We are able to provide emergency rent and utility assistance–for those facing utility cutoff or eviction. Assistance is provided to registered parishioners and households within our parish boundaries (N. Alberta to the Columbia River and N. Denver to NE 26th Ave.). We are able to provide this assistance due to the generosity of parishioners. The Oregon Community Foundation grant program is closed at this time.

EMERGENCY FOOD ASSISTANCE

HR's SVDP Food Room (back side of church, basement level) is open every Wednesday and Saturday, 2:30 - 4:00 PM. Anyone in need of emergency food is encouraged to go to the food room during these hours of operation to be given emergency food. All requests are treated confidentially. All visitors must wear masks.

Holy Redeemer's Giving Tree is here! Take this opportunity to share your many blessings with those in our community and brighten their holiday season.



Dear Friends:

It is an interesting fact that the feast day of John the Baptist falls near the summer solstice, which marks the longest day of the year, but then the days begin to shorten. The birth of Christ falls near the winter solstice, which marks the shortest day of the year, but then the days begin to lengthen. It reminds me of the words of John the

Baptist, who said, "I must decrease and he must increase." It seems most fitting that Christ our light should appear in the time of greatest darkness and that with his appearance the light should grow.

The sun is slow to rise these days and quick to set. Yet in this time when the darkness comes earlier and earlier, we speak of the season of lights. The light of our Advent candles and the lights on our Christmas trees seem to shine more brightly and warmly when it is dark outside.

I get reminded over and over how God brings light in the midst of the world's darkness A few days ago I rode my bike along the Willamette River towards the Tillicum Bridge. I then crossed and made my way north towards the Broadway Bridge. Nothing prepared me for the sight of endless graffiti, the countless boarded up buildings, or the sea of tents along Broadway Street of those who are homeless.

Suddenly, a gentleman in a city park I passed began to play the bagpipes. Then I saw some jugglers showcasing their skills, and further along, I witnessed a few young people walking a tightrope. I think they felt called to give everyone a lift in their own simple way. They were signs of light and joy in the midst of a disheartening scene.

I then had a Zoom call to touch-base with our Hispanic leaders of the parish a few days ago. Despite the tears and hardships shared, I heard the moving testimony of some who are taking food to the homeless each week, or of another who visits the local prison and is helping an older man recently released from prison who has no family. These good people are light bearers to those who are suffering.

A star once heralded that Christ our light was to be born in Bethlehem. Our Advent wreath reminds us that Christ our light is coming anew. St. John wrote "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1:5) Until Christ our light returns in glory, we are the light of Christ in the world to all who need love, light, and warmth.
