

HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded

entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council www.svdppdx.org. Fr. Cameron's Message



Dear Holy Redeemer community,

I write to you with more than a tinge of sadness in my heart, as the whole parish community has recently said good-bye to a pastor who has lovingly and generously devoted his life to serving and ministering the people here these past four and a half years. In addition, Fr. Michael and I have also said good-bye to a friend and a brother in Holy Cross. Still, I can think of no better send-off for a bishop-elect than the show of love and appreciation that came from this community last weekend as we gathered together as one family for a grand farewell fiesta last weekend. On behalf of Fr. Pat, Fr. Michael and myself, I want to share an enormous "thank you!" to all who helped to make that celebration happen by bringing food, drinks, deserts and donating time to help set up for and clean up after the event.

There are too many people to name individually, but I especially want to recognize the efforts of Kathy Battilega and Carmen Salvador in coordinating the whole affair! And finally, thank you to all who came to share these last moments of celebration with our outgoing pastor!

Along with that sadness, there is joy, though! I take joy in knowing that Fr. Pat will soon be ordained as a bishop, and that his pastoral gifts will be put to use in the diocese of St. Cloud, and in union with the other bishops of the United States at a time when our Church faces so many challenges. I am very much looking forward to travelling out to St. Cloud to witness his episcopal ordination this coming week, and I imagine that my next message to you all will include some reflection on that experience.

I thought I would take the rest of this space, however to share another joy I experienced recently. On January 28th, I felt very blest to have the opportunity to be in Guadalupe, Nuevo Leon in Mexico to celebrate another ordination mass. This was the ordination of Pedro José Carreño Medina, C.S.C., to the priesthood. Pedro is a young man from Columbia, who joined the Holy Cross Order in Mexico after meeting some Holy Cross priests at a world youth day in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. He became a friend to me when he lived at Moreau Seminary for one year with us as he studied English, and then our paths were able to cross again when I took a year of my seminary formation to gain pastoral experience serving at our Holy Cross parish in Guadalupe, Mexico, at the same time seeking to improve my Spanish skills.

What tremendous delight I experienced at witnessing Pedro offer his life to Christ and His Church in the sacrament of ordination! The bishop ordaining Pedro was Bishop Jorge Izaguirre of Chuquibamba in Peru—someone who was also a Holy Cross priest before being ordained bishop (like Fr. Pat!), so the whole weekend was really an international Holy Cross family affair, with people visiting from Peru, Chile, and the United States. Below are a few pictures from the Ordination mass.
