Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

Sunday, February 13, is World Marriage Day. A special shout out to all married couples! This is your day and a chance to give thanks for the gift of each other.

As a priest, I love asking couples about how they first met each other. They usually recount very entertaining stories that seem to be more than chance encounters. Then I follow it up with a question as to how the proposal took place. I am always left feeling that Divine Providence is what brings two people together for life.

Marriage is one of the most important institutions in the world. It is the foundation of the church and society. St. John Chrysostom once wrote that, "The love of husband and wife is the force that welds society together."

Though it is rarely talked about, marriage is a vocation for life. Unfortunately, the idea of a vocation is a tough concept for many of today's younger generation to understand. When we fail to see marriage as a vocation we tend to belittle its value. Culturally, more and more young people sacrifice marriage for their career. Our society increasingly communicates to them that career goals can trump marriage and fewer young people even want to get married. We have to help younger people appreciate the idea of married life as a calling from God.

If marriage is a vocation, that means it has to be a couple's life work. It is certainly not just a job or something done on the side. While It is not easy to be married, there is nothing more worthwhile or important. It is the path to holiness for the great majority of human beings on this planet. The goal is to continually grow in love of one's spouse, to accept the inevitable ups and downs of married life, to readily forgive each other, to keep one's sense of humor, and yes, to willingly accept children from the Lord. What could be holier than sharing in God's powerful act of creation through having children? And if your children are already raised, spoil your grandchildren, just to get back at your own children for when they misbehaved years ago!

Pope Francis made me laugh recently when he weighed in on people being selfish by opting to have dogs and cats that take the place of children. He urged potential parents "not to be afraid" of embarking on parenthood. "Having a child is always a risk, but there is more risk in not having a child," he said. I suspect he is on to something.

So married people, my hat is off to you. No marriage is perfect but neither is any human being. Every marriage matters and every marriage is holy in its own crazy way. Therefore, go ahead and have children and have your cats, dogs, rabbits and even guinea pigs. Also throw in a romantic dinner, sports, trips to the coast, some Salt & Straw ice cream and, of course, coming to Mass as a family to get perspective, grace, and strength from God to live out your married vocation to be best of your ability.
