





Fr. Paul's Message



Dear Holy Redeemer,

This Sunday's Gospel is about the Transfiguration. It may seem a bit strange given our time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving to hear about the glory and splendor of Christ, and we might ask ourselves: Why does the Church present this Gospel in the middle of Lent?

Shortly before this event, Jesus announces to the apostles His passion and death, as well as His resurrection on the third day. But the apostles do not understand. In the middle of Lent, the scripture makes us see, and hopefully hope, that everything is reconciled in the Resurrection of Jesus. Only through Easter, does the passion and death on Calvary acquire their true meaning. Only in resurrection, does our suffering and pain here on earth find their true end in reunion and everlasting life with God.

Now what did the transfiguration mean in the life of the apostles? They were used to Jesus. They saw Him every day, drank and ate with Him, knew everything He did, listened to countless preachings and teachings. And the more they listened to Him, maybe the less attention they showed, the less they understood Him, the less open they were to what He had to teach them. Jesus, Son of God, became familiar in the worst sense, too easily contained, too easily taken for granted.

Then the Lord judged that this situation could not continue, that the apostles needed a vision, a transfiguration. One day He takes them aside and takes them to a high mountain - according to tradition, Mount Tabor. And in solitude and silence up there, they calm down, are awestruck, freed from their worries and ambitions.

They are alone with Jesus: now they begin to look at Him, to really look at Him, to know Him more deeply. And when they hear the voice above: "This is my Son, the chosen one; listen to Him", then they open their eyes and their minds and know the presence of God, the infinite creator of all time and space, present here before them. They realize that Jesus is much more than just a prophet. They are so full of joy that they want to stay there forever: "How beautiful it is to be here. We will make three tents: one for You, one for Moses and one for Elijah. "They want to build quickly, temples, tabernacles, places to commune with God The Most High.

This Eucharist, this Mass we celebrate, is a transfiguration of sorts. Deep down, this is what should happen now, in this Eucharist, if we are open with our heart and with our eyes. Because Jesus is present at each Mass. He has just spoken to us through his Word. And soon we will see Him on the altar, in his Body and Blood. In communion we can receive Him and unite intimately with Him.

How is it possible, then, that we don't feel like staying here, next to the Lord? I wish that miracle could be performed: The miracle that we didn't want to leave Mass, that we wanted to stay here in this magnificent tent, to eternally live in that happy moment.

Do you not know that you too are temples of the Holy Spirit? That each of your bodies are tents for God's presence, houses of the Holy. We will proclaim that today with our baptism.

That would be the decisive sign that we have understood Christ, that we have attended Mass with an open heart to the celebration, that we have freed ourselves from the routine and have realized what was really happening in the Eucharist. You are all beloved children of God, signs of the resurrection, hope for the hopeless, see, hear, and know how God can transfigure you, all through Christ our Lord.
