

There is no charge for the books, but SVDP accepts donations to provide food, rent and utility assistance to our neighbors in need.



HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our

conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council <u>www.svdppdx.org</u>. Fr. Cameron's Message



Dear Holy Redeemer parishioners,

I wish you all well as we begin together this Lenten journey of fasting, alms-giving, and prayer in anticipation of the Church's most glorious celebration of the year on Easter Sunday. This

season is a rich time for conversion and interior renewal if we enter into these practices with an earnest spirit desiring to draw closer to God, and be filled with His mercy and love.

I begin with a brief reminder of our communal activities in the parish that all are welcome to participate in this coming season:

- **Operation Rice Bowl containers** and prayers can be found at the Church doors during this time, as a way of collecting Lenten savings to donate to Catholic Relief Services' many missions to the poor.
- **Eucharistic Adoration** continues to take place from 4:30-7:30pm each Thursday.
- **Stations of the Cross** takes place each Friday at 6pm in English and 7pm in Spanish.
- **Confessions** are offered from 3:30-4:30pm on Saturdays or any other time by appointment with Fr. Michael or myself.

A **Parish Reconciliation Service** will occur on Monday, March 6th at 7pm.

Secondly, I want to deliver on my promise to share a few memories from my time in Minnesota attending Bishop Patrick Neary's ordination on Tuesday February 14th.

The ceremony was incredibly moving, as was the Vespers prayer service the night before with a short homily (infused with quite a few humorous jabs at our ex-pastor) —given by Fr. Bill Lies, our Holy Cross Provincial Superior here in the U.S.A. The Ordination Mass itself had a lot in common with a priestly ordination, but a few features were distinct:

Anointing: In the anointing of a bishop, not just the hands, but the head are anointed with sacred chrism. Archbishop Hebda was quite generous with his pouring, and Fr. Pat seemed to have just emerged from an oil bath after this part of the celebration!

The Handing on of the Book of the Gospels: After the anointing, Bishop Pat was presented with a book of the Gospels, a symbol of his responsibility to preach the Gospel of Christ at all times. Before it was handed on however, The Gospels were held aloft and opened over Bishop Pat's head as Archbishop Hebda and two other bishops prayed the prayer of Ordination. This symbol was a powerful reminder that even as our beloved expastor is invested with great authority as a bishop, he must always stand humbly under the Word of God. **Symbols of the Episcopacy:** Bishop Pat was presented with a ring, signifying a kind of spousal fidelity to the Church, the Bride of Christ, and his commitment to be 'wedded' to the Diocese of St. Cloud. Then he received a miter, the pointy bishop's hat that signifies his resolve to pursue holiness, and the crosier, the pastoral staff, representing his duty of guiding and governing the Church as a good shepherd.

The Cathedra. After the ordination rite took place, the mass carried on towards the liturgy of the Eucharist, but Archbishop Hebda led the now Bishop Pat to the bishop's chair in the Cathedral of St. Mary, to preside at the rest of the mass. This is the only occasion where I have ever been at a mass in which the presider switches partway through the liturgy
