FASTING AND ABSTINENCE REGULATIONS



ALL CATHOLICS, 14 YEARS AND OLDER, MUST ABSTAIN FROM MEAT ON ASH WEDNESDAY AND THE FRIDAYS OF LENT. ALL CATHOLICS BETWEEN THE AGES OF 18 AND 59 ARE TO FAST ON ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY. TO FAST MEANS TO EAT ONE FULL MEAL; THE OTHER TWO MEALS THAT DAY SHOULD BE LESS THAN THE NORMAL AMOUNT UNLESS THEY ARE ALREADY A MINIMUM FOR GOOD HEALTH. EATING BEWTEEN MEALS IS NOT PERMITTED HOWEVER. LIQUIDS INCLUDING COFFEE, MILK AND FRUIT JUICES ARE ALLOWED.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Alleluia! This year **Easter Sunday falls on April 17**, which is the first Sunday after the first full moon following the Spring Equinox. Easter is scheduled according to the lunar calendar, the calendar which was and is followed by the Jews. The date for Easter Sunday and Ash Wednesday and Pentecost all change each year depending on the cycle of the moon. Interesting, right?

But Easter Sunday is important for us because it is the day, after the 45 days of Lent, that we who are baptized come to Mass and renew the promises of our Baptism. During the Lenten season, for those of us who are already Catholic Christians, we fast and pray and reach out with alms to the poor so that we can renew our lives in Christ and be renewed in the Spirit, whom we received at our Baptism. For those who are not yet baptized, such as catechumens and inquirers of the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**, Lent is a time for them to prepare for their baptism.

The season of Lent was originally 40 days long and began on a Sunday, however, during the Middle Ages additional days were added to Lent: first a Saturday, then a Friday, then a Thursday until they even added a Wednesday. This is where we get "Ash Wednesday." Thus, our season of Lent is 45 days and runs from Ash Wednesday through sundown of Holy Thursday.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2, and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday, April 14. The "Three Great Days" of the Triduum are Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. These three days merge into one 72-hour period of prayer, worship, silence, song, Scripture and church services, which begin on Holy Thursday evening and end with the conclusion of the Easter Vigil Service on the evening of Holy Saturday.

This year, we have **two Masses on Ash Wednesday**, 7:15 am in English and Bilingual at 7:00 pm. Ashes will be imposed on people's foreheads by the minister this year as we move beyond the COVID protocols. On Fridays of Lent, we will have Stations of the Cross in English at 6 pm and in Spanish at 7 pm.

Traditionally, Lent is a time of increased fasting and alms giving (or raising money from our fasting to care for the poor. We choose to fast so that those who have no choice, but cannot eat because they are poor, can benefit from our sacrifices. Lent is a time for more prayer, participating in daily Mass, praying the Way of the Cross (Stations of the Cross) or the Rosary, spending time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in adoration, such as offered here on Thursdays 4:30pm - 7:30 pm.

This year, the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday is at 7 pm followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in Clare Hall. On Good Friday, an English Passion Service will be at 5 pm and one in Spanish at 7 pm. The Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday will be at 9 pm. During Holy Week on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, we will have Morning Prayer in the church at 8:30 am.

All of this is so that we can be renewed in our life in Christ and come to celebrate the Easter mysteries with joy. **Alleluia!**
