# Fr. Paul's Message





Dear Holy Redeemer,

This weekend we have the lovely and tragic Book of Job. This book of the Bible puts at its very core the problem of sickness and suffering: why should I suffer? Why should the innocent and faithful experience crushing pain and loss?

Job has lost everything, wealth, family, health. He sits on a rubbish-heap, scratching his sores with a broken pot. In this Sunday's passage Job gives a painful picture of the sick person's frustration, the slow and pointless passage of time, the crazy, distorted imaginings. He feels that God is oppressing him, yet Job clings to God as his one hope of release.

Undeserved sickness and death is worrying for anyone who believes in a loving God. Our experience of sickness is a reminder that things are out of order and could get worse. To the believer it is a reminder that this brilliant, complicated, sophisticated creation cannot continue developing forever, but must return to God in God's own good time. From dust we came and unto dust we shall return.

As Jeremiah explains, the pot cannot complain to the potter, 'Why did you make me like this?' But couldn't a loving God have made something so that it never went wrong? Or is it the consequence of our revolts against God that confidence in God has given way to fear and mistrust?

This is most likely why the people in today's Gospel passage from Mark are so crazed in following Jesus. As Jesus ministers from place to place bringing healing and trust back into the world, many questions arise. Are people just happy for the relief, the healing, the miraculous? Or are they finding a deeper way of being that Job ultimately found, the greatest gift in this life is not wealth, health, or abundance of good fortune.

The greatest gift is a deep profound relationship with God, from there all of Christ ministry flows and from there Job will receive his deliverance. Do we see our prayer life and communion with God as his greatest gift, our time at Mass, our praying the rosary, our time spent listening to God? Because if we truly did, then all our actions would bring glory to God and we'd make heaven a place on earth.
