

HOLY REDEEMER SVDP CONFERENCE

As of 1/21/2021, we've served 24 families with \$6,049 in food/rent. Holy Redeemer church/school donated 2,213 lbs. of food and volunteers offered 39 hours of time. Thank you for your ongoing love and sacrifices.

RENT & UTILITY ASSISTANCE

We are able to provide emergency rent and utility assistance-for those facing utility cutoff or eviction. Assistance is provided to registered parishioners and households within our parish boundaries (N. Alberta to the Columbia River and N. Denver to NE 26th Ave.). We are able to provide this assistance due to the generosity of parishioners.

EMERGENCY FOOD ASSISTANCE

HR's SVDP Food Room (back side of church, basement level) is open every Wednesday and Saturday, 2:30 - 4:00 PM. Anyone in need of emergency food is encouraged to go to the food room during these hours of operation to be given emergency food. All requests are treated confidentially. NEW MASS ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES


Governor Brown announced new coronavirus guidelines on November 25. Faith institutions will be limited to a maximum of 25% capacity or 100 people indoors. With our current capacity and physical distancing requirements, we will be able to accommodate up to 22 groups of people, not to exceed 100 people total per Mass.

ASH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 17, 2021

Due to the pandemic, ashes will not be imposed on people's foreheads this year to avoid any possible transmission of Corona Virus 19. Instead, for those who wish to receive ashes on Ash Wednesday, the Archdiocese has directed us to sprinkle the ashes upon a person's head. In ancient Jewish custom and during the time of Jesus' life, the sprinkling of ashes was a sign of sorrow and sadness. And so, for this year, we'll use the blessed ashes in this way as we "Repent and believe in the Gospel!"

On Ash Wednesday, there will be three Masses offered at Holy Redeemer: 12:00pm Noon (English), 7:00pm (Bilingual) and 8:30pm Spanish.

Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

It was about a year ago that I was excited to read the news about a limited-release movie entitled, "I am Patrick." It was going to be shown on St. Patrick's Day in many local theatres. My trip to South Bend, Indiana, for a mid-March Provincial Council meeting had been cancelled because of fears of the rapidly spreading coronavirus. So I figured the next best thing would be to see this movie in town. The night before, however, when I checked my on-line ticket receipt, it showed that the movie had been

cancelled. This was perhaps the first sign to me that something serious was underfoot, though I had no way of knowing how rapidly it would all unfold.

Never in my entire life could I imagine a scenario that would shut down our country for so long, nor did I think it possible that students would be prevented from attending school in person for almost an entire year. The longest I was every out of school was for one entire week during the Blizzard of 1978 that hit the middle part of the country. We had some snow piles as high as the lower roof of our garage and it took several days before anyone could even drive anywhere. But there was a collective sense of fun and fascination for us kids out playing in the massive mounds of snow. And given the non-existence of internet and personal computers in those days, it was blessedly free of homework!

There hasn't been anything fun or fascinating about this pandemic, especially when it comes to school for our children or for their parents. I know that it has been emotionally tough on our children to be disconnected from their classmates, as well as from all of the sports and special events associated with a school like ours. And certainly parents have felt increased stress and anxiety whenever they saw that their kids were struggling.

We have all been looking for a light at the end of the tunnel, some sign that our school might begin the path back to normalcy at some point in the near future. Then Governor Brown announced her decision to prioritize the vaccination of teachers. I'm pleased to report that our teachers and staff were finally able to receive the first dose of the Covid-19 vaccination. The second dose is not far behind. Given that reality, our Principal, Deirdre McPheeters, has announced that plans are underway to bring our students in first to third grade back to campus for in-person instruction, beginning on Wednesday, February 24.

Students are not required to return for in-person instruction, however, and our Comprehensive Distance Learning (CDL) will be offered for the remainder of the year.

We are not yet out of the woods with this pandemic. Holy Redeemer School will be required to adhere to a very strict protocol to help limit the potential for spreading Covid-19. Nonetheless, seeing our students back at school is a shot in the arm for all of us. And hopefully the return of students in the upper grades will soon follow.

I cannot say enough in praise of our Principal, our teachers, and our staff for their tireless and heroic service of our students under extremely trying conditions. I wish that we could afford to send all of them on an exotic and extended vacation at some tropical resort. Short of that, may they know of our deep gratitude for a job well done. May God continue to be with them until we see this pandemic through!
