

NEW MASS ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES

Governor Brown announced new coronavirus guidelines on November 25. Faith institutions will be limited to a maximum of 25% capacity or 100 people indoors. With our current capacity and physical distancing requirements, we will be able to accommodate up to 22 groups of people, not to exceed 100 people total per Mass.

SVDP FOOD PANTRY VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

We have openings for **TWO Volunteers to JOIN the Food Pantry Crew** on Wednesday 2:15-4:15pm in the HR Food Pantry in the basement of the church. volunteers **work 2 hours once every four weeks**. During the Covid emergency, only Volunteers work in the pantry, packing boxes to give out to clients and their families. All volunteers are wearing masks and using gloves. This is a great opportunity for HR Parents to earn Fair Share Hours. Commitment is 2 hours every 4 weeks. Most volunteers say that they receive much more than they give from their involvement in this ministry. RENT & UTILITY ASSISTANCE

We are able to provide emergency rent and utility assistance-for those facing utility cutoff or eviction. Assistance is provided to registered parishioners and households within our parish boundaries (N. Alberta to the Columbia River and N. Denver to NE 26th Ave.). We are able to provide this assistance due to the generosity of parishioners. The Oregon Community Foundation grant program is closed at this time.

EMERGENCY FOOD ASSISTANCE

HR's SVDP Food Room (back side of church, basement level) is open every Wednesday and Saturday, 2:30 - 4:00 PM. Anyone in need of emergency food is encouraged to go to the food room during these hours of operation to be given emergency food. All requests are treated confidentially. All visitors must wear masks. **SVDP PANTRY NEEDS:** Fresh eggs, canned meals/meats/tuna, peanut butter, jelly, cereal & fresh fruits. YEAR END GIVING



Pastor's Message

Dear Friends:



occasion of his baptism in the Jordan River. This event can be seen as a second creation in which the entire Trinity is present. In the Eastern Church this feast is called *Theophany* because at the baptism of Christ in the River Jordan God appeared in three persons.

We know that Jesus did not need the baptism of John, which was offered for the washing away of sins and making a new beginning. Jesus was like us in all things but sin. But this event marks the end of Jesus' private life in Nazareth where he was the humble carpenter's son. At his baptism the Holy Spirit descends upon him and the voice of the Father confirms that he is God's beloved Son. He is now empowered to begin his mission to take away the sins of the world, and to set God's people free by his death and resurrection.

His baptism is meant to remind us of our own baptism. Just as the Holy Spirit descended upon Christ at his baptism, so at our baptism the Trinity took up residence in our hearts. As Jesus was proclaimed the "Beloved Son" of the Father at his baptism, we became beloved sons and daughters of God at our own baptism. At his baptism, the heavens opened for him, and at our baptism heaven was opened for us. Christ was commissioned a priest, prophet, and king, and so were we when we were anointed with Chrism oil at our baptism.

We are now moving into Ordinary Time in our church calendar. While we understand what this means, we know that the year we have just completed has been far from ordinary. It has been a year of loss, isolation, and hardship for so many. God has anointed us to be Christ in this world and to bring Good News to people who feel lost, lonely, unloved, sad or afraid. We are to let others know that they are God's beloved sons and daughters. We are to fight for justice whenever we see any of God's children being mistreated.

The meaning of our baptism is best summed up for me by this prayer from St. Teresa of Avila: Christ has no body now on earth, but yours. No hands but yours. No feet but yours. Yours are the eyes through which the compassion of Christ must look out on the world. Yours are the feet with which He is to go about doing good. Yours are the hands with which He is to bless His people.
