How we pray should translate itself into how we live. Liturgists like to use the shorthand tag "lex orandi, lex agendi" or the rule of prayer leads to the rule of actions. Fr. Michael Driscoll explores the relationship between Eucharist and ethics, liturgy and life, and the declaration of the 2005 Synod on the Eucharist: "The Eucharist moves Christians to a commitment of justice in today's world..."



We had a lovely potluck dinner together in the school cafeteria to kick off the Confirmation Year together. Then we moved to the church for a brief orientation as to the meaning of the Sacrament of Confirmation and a review of practical matters.

We concluded our evening with a beautiful ceremony where the parents made the sign of the cross on their teen's forehead, ears, eyes, and hands. For the blessing of their foreheads, we prayed: "Receive the sign of the Cross on your forehead. It is Christ himself who strengthens you with this sign of His love. Seek to know Him more deeply and follow him." For the blessing of their ears, we prayed: "Receive the sign of the Cross on your ears, that you may hear the voice of the Lord." For the blessing of their eyes, we prayed, "Receive the sign of the Cross on your eyes, that you may see the glory of God." For the blessing of their hands, we prayed, "Receive the sign of the Cross on your eyes, that you may see the glory of God." It all harkened back to their baptism when their parents first traced the sign of the Cross on their foreheads.

We pray for our Confirmation Team and for all of the young people in our Confirmation Program. May they come to know Christ in a new and powerful way, and truly feel the touch of the Holy Spirit when they are confirmed on April 29 at the Cathedral.
