







GIVING TREE BLESSINGS!

Pastor's Message



Dear Friends: Happy New Year!



We can only hope that 2022 ends up being a less stressful year for all of us, with a gradual release from the strain of this pandemic and a greater return to normalcy in our city and in our country.

On a positive note, this is a time for New Year's Resolutions. From what I gather, most resolutions are made to be broken. So as your Pastor, maybe I can suggest a few simple ones that might be possible to implement without the guilt factor.

- Use airplane mode on your phone for 5-7 minutes a day. Just find a window of time, wherever you
 can, where you won't be bothered. Take a few conscious breaths, greet the Lord, and simply be still
 and aware in the space in which you find yourself. If you wish, find a Scripture passage from the
 Psalms, one of the Gospels, or the letters (epistles) in the Testament. Just a few lines will take you
 deeper into stillness.
- Though it feels awkward at first, consider a brief prayer with your family before retiring for the night. Everyone says one thing that they are grateful for from the day. Mom or Dad can offer a petition or two for anyone they know of in need. Then say the Our Father together. As Fr. Patrick Peyton said, "The family that prays together stays together."
- Consider praying with your spouse when you lay down in bed to retire for the night. Offer a simple
 prayer for each other and make the sign of the cross on each other's forehead to conclude. It will
 make a difference in your daily life as a couple.
- Think about reaching out to one person a week you've kind of lost touch with through a text message, email, or phone call. Just let them know that you are thinking about them. You'll be amazed often by the response you get back.
- Strive to forgive someone this year that you've had a hard time forgiving. Ask God for the grace to want to forgive, keep praying for this grace, and try and consciously focus on whatever good you can find in this person (it can be hard to do in some cases!). In time, you will see your heart has grown free of a heavy weight because you can finally think of this person without getting all worked up.
- Pray for a person each week whom you dislike, disagree with, or even despise. It can even be someone you don't know except through the media. Love your enemies, Jesus said. To pray for an enemy with sincerity of heart makes us true children of God.
- Get out in nature and commune with God's creation. It is often in the stillness of a walk in the woods, in a park, or along the beach that God whispers to us.
- Read an inspiring book or novel that you've been meaning to read for a long time. Just read a little
 bit over the course of a week. Within a few months you read the whole book. Good literature uplifts
 our spirit, gets us thinking on a deeper level, and increases our empathy for the human condition.

These are just a few simple ideas. Perhaps you have others. Regardless, may this New Year bring us many spiritual graces. Our world needs them more than ever!
