

HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner

agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council <u>www.svdppdx.org</u>. Fact: The first Catholic school that opened in the United States was St. Mary's School in Philadelphia in 1783. From there, enthusiasm and curiosity for Catholic education grew when the nation experienced a massive inflow of Catholics from all over the world. By the 1920s, more than 6,000 Catholic elementary schools accepted and enrolled almost two million students and employed 42,000 teachers. By the latter half of that century, enrollment grew, even more, reaching double the number of students. Ever since Catholic schools have been widely perceived and established as a viable means of education.

Fact: Currently, there are 5,938 Catholic schools in the United States and Holy Redeemer Catholic Grade School is one of them! **Hurray! Go Wildcats!**

Catholic Schools week is always celebrated near the Memorial of St. Thomas Aquinas, January 28. As a Doctor of the Church, his writings carry special meaning for us as we delve deeper into our Catholic Faith and strive to understand its mysteries. St. Thomas is also a noted Dominican theologian whose ability to use the philosophy of Aristotle, a great Greek thinker, within a system of theology called Scholasticism is still used today.
