HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council www.svdppdx.org. 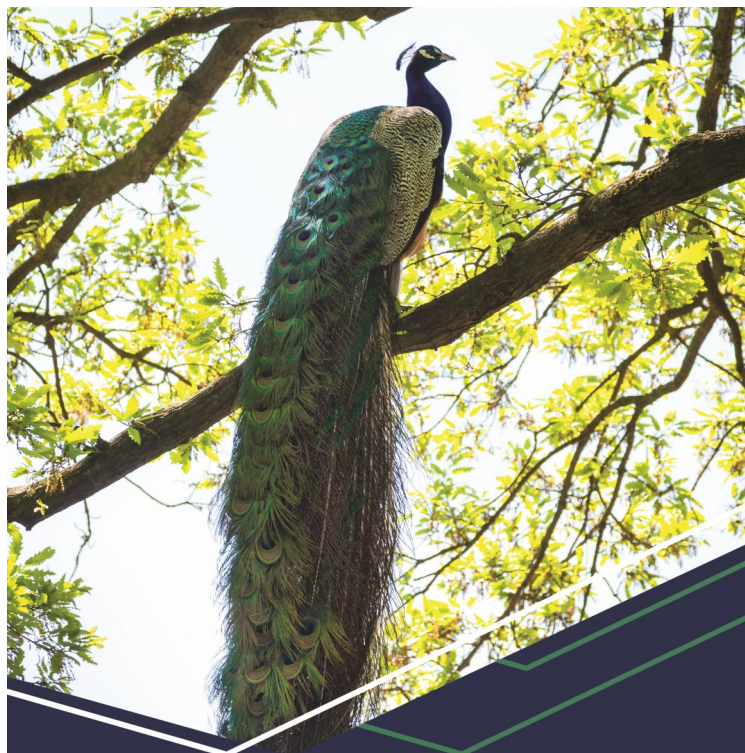

NATIONAL CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK: Celebrating the legacy of the Congregation of Holy Cross

Today marks the beginning of National Catholic Schools Week! It is a time to recognize and celebrate the important role that Catholic education has played (and continues to play) in this country in handing on the Faith across generations, and in forming young people to become loving and virtuous disciples of Christ. This parish has been in the pastoral care of the Congregation of Holy Cross for the last 20 years, I would like to mark this week by sharing a bit about our religious order's legacy in contributing to Catholic education.

The goal of making faith-informed education accessible to all people was at the heart of Holy Cross's founding charism during its birth in post-revolutionary France. Our order was formed by Blessed Fr. Basil Anthony Moreau in 1837 by the joining together of two societies, both of which were under Fr. Moreau's leadership at the time: a community of Auxiliary Priests, and the Brothers of St. Joseph. The priests' main mission was to revive the Church through preaching parish missions and educating youth at colleges and seminaries. The brothers' mission was entirely focused on teaching in Catholic schools. The community of Sisters founded by Fr. Moreau soon became involved in education ministries as well.

Holy Cross's mission developed due to the need to fill a major hole left by the French Revolution, wherein the newly formed Republic cut off all government support to any Catholic institutions, forcing the vast majority of France's schools to shut down. In many areas of France, especially more remote and rural regions, the new secular government's plans to provide universal schooling did not materialize, and so an entire generation was left without access to any education at all, let alone a Catholic education.

It was very early on in our order's history (1841) that Holy Cross first sent priests and brothers to the United States of America when Bishop Hailandière of Vincennes, Indiana requested for Fr. Moreau to send religious educators to found new schools. Among those sent was Fr. Edward Sorin, an indefatigable visionary of a priest, who eventually founded the University of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, and St. Edward's University in Austin, Texas.

Today, Holy Redeemer Catholic School is among 30 different schools (ranging from primary to secondary to colleges and universities) that have active ties to the Congregation of Holy Cross. Holy Cross also oversees two programs of formation for young teachers to serve in Catholic schools—the Alliance for Catholic Education at Notre Dame (ACE), and the Pacific Alliance for Catholic Education at the University of Portland (PACE). Teachers who obtain their masters' degrees through these programs, as well as educators who graciously serve in Holy Cross institutions across the country, strive to educate in a way that attends to the whole person, embracing the integration of intellectual, moral, and academic formation. This is in the spirit of Fr. Moreau who wrote, "we shall always place education side by side with instruction; the mind will not be cultivated at the expense of the heart. While we prepare citizens for society, we shall likewise do our utmost to prepare citizens for heaven."
