Fr. Paul's Message



Dear Holy Redeemer,

As we move toward Epiphany (January 7th) after having celebrated Christmas (December 25th), I am reminded of the song "The Twelve Days of Christmas." Some have been led to believe that it was used by English Catholics to teach their children biblical teachings. Others have thought that it was a game played between musicians and the crowd, originating first in France. As the singer played the song, members of the crowd were tested on their memory of the lyrics, a wrong answer could illicit a kiss or a dare. Most likely the latter is true, it being a game, but it is nice to think that faith can be used when we think of songs like "The Twelve Days of Christmas,"

especially since we are celebrating the presence of Christ born into the world. And so I will share with you an "interpretation" of the lyrics:

The "true love" mentioned in the song might not refer to an earthly suitor at all, but to God Himself. The "gave to me" who receives the presents may refer to every baptized person. The partridge in a pear tree is Jesus Christ, the Son of God. In the song, Christ may symbolically represent a mother partridge who feigns injury to decoy predators from her helpless children, much in memory of the expression of Christ's sadness over the fate of Jerusalem: "Jerusalem! Jerusalem! How often would I have sheltered you under my wings, as a hen does her chicks, but you would not have it so."

The other symbols mean the following:

- 2 Turtle Doves = the Old and New Testaments
- 3 French Hens = Faith, Hope and Charity, the Theological Virtues
- 4 Calling Birds = the Four Gospels and/or the Four Evangelists
- 5 Golden Rings = the first Five Books of the Old Testament, the Pentateuch, which gives the history of Man's fall from grace.
- 6 Geese A-laying = the six days of creation
- 7 Swans A-swimming = the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, the seven sacraments
- 8 Maids A-milking = the eight beatitudes
- 9 Ladies Dancing = the nine Fruits of the Holy Spirit
- 10 Lords A-leaping = the Ten Commandments
- 11 Pipers Piping = the eleven faithful apostles
- 12 Drummers Drumming = the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostle's Creed
