
## SYNOD PRAYER FROM THE VATICAN

# **Pastor's Message**

This Sunday, January 9th, brings our celebration of Christmas to an end. We move around quickly from the **Birth of our Lord** (Dec. 25) to Joseph and Mary, as the **Holy Family**, "losing" Jesus as a 12-year-old in the Temple of Jerusalem (Dec. 26), to **Mary, the Mother of God**, and Joseph pondering the Lord's Birth (Jan. 1) to the Gentile astrologers who bring gifts to the Christ Child whose **Epiphany** reveals to all that through the gift of gold, Jesus is a King, through the gift of frankincense, Jesus is divine, and through the gift of myrrh, that Jesus will die (Jan. 2) to our recognition of the **Lord's Baptism** as an adult by John in the Jordan River. Whew. Did you catch all of this? The only major event that is left out of this sequence is the Lord's first miracle at the wedding feast of Canaan where he transformed water into wine.

In all these moments, we recall how God saves us as God took on human flesh and human mortality - the mystery of the Incarnation - and how Jesus shows us the way to live through His words and actions, with today's focus on His Baptism. I wonder how many of us ponder the connection between the Lord's own baptism and ours? I wonder if we really believe, deep down in our flesh and bones, that Jesus is truly like us in our human nature? And I wonder, beyond that, if we really believe, deep down in our heart and souls, that through our Baptism and the gifts of the Holy Spirit, we live beyond the limits of our humanity and live in the light and life of divinity? I just wonder. Don't you?

And as we reflect on the meaning of our Baptism into Christ, into becoming members of His Body - the Church - we remember those who lived out their baptism in extraordinary ways, like **Fr. Augustus Tolton, the first African American Catholic priest** who contended with racism, both within our American culture and within the Catholic Church. On Monday, our grade school students will have an opportunity to witness the one-man play which will be held at our church. Likewise, those who have RSVP'd will be able to attend the performance on Monday evening. From what other clergy and Archbishop Sample have said, this production is excellent and provides much cause for thought for those for who see it.

Getting back to Christmas ... the entire season used to span Dec. 25 through Feb. 2 (40 days) which is why we still celebrate the Feast of the Lord's Presentation on Feb. 2. So, if your Xmas decorations are still up by the end of January, like mine are, know that you're continuing a much older sequence of Christmastide.
