## HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian

enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council <u>www.svdppdx.org</u>. ## **CONFIRMATION REGISTRATION**

Our parish is now ready to start receiving registrations for our two-year confirmation program, which will begin in the fall. Families of teens going into the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and older are invited to fill out registration forms either in the parish office during weekday office hours or on our parish website at <u>https://holyredeemerpdxchurch.org/confirmation-1</u>. September 2nd is the deadline for registration. Confirmation candidates will typically meet from 2-3:30pm on Sundays throughout the academic year, beginning on September 11th.

# Message from Fr. Cameron and Philippe Kreiter, DRE



Dear Holy Redeemer parishioners,

As many of you know the parish is going to undergo some changes in its confirmation program. We have sought to communicate the basics of *what* these changes are, but we would like to use this space to share a message about the *why*, and to elaborate on the vision that informs this new direction.

In all of these changes, we want to meet the needs of our youth as we seek to foster in them a strong relationship with Christ and a positive experience of His Mystical Body, the Church. Ultimately, we hope that our youth will hold the conviction that active and regular participation in sacraments, service, prayer and community are worth treasuring and practicing, and that families will feel even stronger together in faith.

The Archdiocese is asking that we adapt our programs so that by 2025, Confirmation will take place during the Spring of 7th-grade. There are advantages to this change: Youth will have the knowledge provided by Confirmation preparation and the gifts of the Holy Spirit as they transition into full adolescence and pursue their high school studies. They will prepare for and receive the sacrament of confirmation at a time when it is natural that parents and youth are more involved together. Also, they will be able to participate in liturgical and other ministries throughout their high school years.

The parish is also transitioning to a two-year Confirmation program this year. We understand that this asks more of families than in the past. However, we are convinced that our parish community needs to better serve our youth. There are fewer young people present and involved in church today. Of course, many external cultural forces contribute to this reality. Nonetheless, we can do more to draw our youth into fuller participation in our community, while serving and supporting those who are regularly here and involved. Our intention is to integrate our two-year process with a youth group in order to achieve this end. As this vision develops, Confirmation students and youth group members will all be involved in service activities, retreats, prayer, recreation and social time at the church or other sites. At other times, they will meet separately: youth groups will gather in homes, or other safe and comfortable spaces, for themed activities and discussions, while confirmation classes meet to study and prepare for Confirmation –both involving prayer <u>and food</u>! Over time, our youth groups will provide a core group to help with First Communion and Reconciliation preparation, Confirmation preparation, children's liturgy and leadership within the youth group. This process will build a strong sense of youth community, peer leadership, and active participation in the worship and work of the Church. Our vision includes formation and support for parents, in the form of occasional parent meetings throughout the year.

The new two-year program will begin this year, September 2022, with weekly Sunday meetings taking place from 2-3:30pm. We also plan to provide an optional light lunch for students at 1:30pm each Sunday.

We look forward to working with our 8th – 12th graders this year. Serving our youth and helping them to grow in faith, hope, and love is not just the work of a few, but a task of our whole church community. We ask that the whole parish become involved by active support of this program and prayer. Parishioners can become actively involved by: providing an adult presence during Confirmation meetings; preparing one meal during the year for the students who come early; or opening your home on occasion to welcome a youth group gathering. Please reach out to us if you feel called to support in any of these ways. This is for our youth, our present our future and one of our greatest gifts from God.
