such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Learn more at <u>www.svdppdx.org</u>.



Fr. Paul's Message



Dear Holy Redeemer:

Wallace Stegner once wrote: *There is a sense in which we are all each other's consequence.*

Christ beckons to come follow, to take up our cross daily and follow Him. That path is a path of consequence. We are being called to relate to Christ first, but in turn that makes our lives an extension of Him. This is at the heart of the Eucharistic feast. We become what we receive, in turn we serve as He would serve. This is not just an invitation to eternal life. Everyone is willing to say yes to that. It is an invitation to a life of consequence, a life that is deeply connected to all God's children. Therefore, as Christ felt compassion for us, gave his life for us while we were still sinners, we are called to do the same, give our lives in service for others, whether they deserve it or not. I will leave with a prayer. I did not write it, Mother Theresa took it from a Dr. Kent Keith and applied our Catholic understanding, I readily pray it often.

People are often unreasonable, illogical, and self-centered. Forgive them anyway.

If you are kind, people may accuse you of selfish ulterior motives. Be kind anyway.

If you are successful, you will win some false friends and some true enemies. Succeed anyway.

If you are honest and frank, people may cheat you. Be honest and frank anyway.

What you spend years building, someone could destroy overnight. Build anyway.

If you find serenity and happiness, they may be jealous. Be happy anyway.

The good you do today, people will often forget tomorrow. Do good anyway.

Give the world the best you have, and it may never be enough. Give the best you've got anyway.

You see, in the final analysis it is between you and God; It was never between you and them anyway.
