## HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council [www.svdppdx.org](http://www.svdppdx.org). ## Fr. Pat's Message



Dear Friends:

I recently returned from the General Chapter of the Congregation of Holy Cross in Rome. It was wonderful to be with close to 80 Holy Cross priests and brothers from around the world. I especially enjoyed Mass each day that featured sacred music and scriptural readings in the languages of the various countries in which Holy Cross serves. Our nearly three weeks together were quite full but fruitful. For the first time in our 185 year history, the Vatican allowed us to elect a Holy Cross brother to serve as our Superior General. Bro. Paul Bednarczyk, an American Holy Cross brother, was elected as our new Superior General on July 1<sup>st</sup>.

While the days were long and the weather quite hot and humid, we managed to sneak out in the coolness of the evenings for gelato. I managed to visit beautiful Assisi, one of my favorite towns in Italy, on our first free day, and on the day before we finished the General Chapter I managed to visit the Basilicas of St Mary Major, St. John Lateran, and St. Peter's in Rome. I also was privileged to attend the Noon Angelus with Pope Francis one Sunday and to receive his blessing from his balcony high above St. Peter's Square. As much as I enjoyed my time in Rome, it is good to be back home at Holy Redeemer Parish.

Like all of you, I was shocked to learn, while away in Rome, that a protest organized by local anarchists was to take place in Peninsula Park on July 1st, and that Holy Redeemer church would likely be targeted. Through the assistance and wise counsel of Tom Markgraf, Fr. Michael was able to make contact with the local news media, members of the Portland Police Department, and to hire a security firm to help prepare for potential unrest and violence. Thankfully, the media attention and police presence discouraged many who had planned to gather in Peninsula Park that evening, and those who did attend were prevented from attacking the church building itself. I recognize that the church building remains vulnerable given the current situation in Portland. We continue to pray for peace in our city.

Lastly, I was so pleased to be present last Sunday at 2 p.m. for a walk-by to show support for Mari Galati as she contends with some ongoing health issues. We had close to 50 Holy Redeemer parishioners and friends in attendance, many of them former or current students of Mari. She was visibly touched by this outward show of love and concern on the part of so many. We continue to pray for her continued healing and well-being. We miss her at Holy Redeemer School.
