### HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council [www.svdppdx.org](http://www.svdppdx.org). ## Archbishop Alexander K. Sample's Message



On June 24, Archbishop Sample offered the following press release:

### **Pastoral Statement from Archbishop Sample on U.S. Supreme Court Ruling in Dobbs v. Jackson**

In answer to the prayers and heroic efforts of many over these past decades, today the Supreme Court ruled to reverse the flawed Roe v. Wade decision of 1973 and return the decision to restrict abortion to individual states. This is an important step forward in rebuilding a culture of life that respects and protects the inherent dignity of every human being, from conception to natural death, especially for those who are disproportionately targeted by the abortion industry.

Although this is a promising decision, it does not mark the end of our efforts: it marks a new beginning. Our goal has never been simply to make abortion illegal. Our goal is to make it unthinkable. Our battle to protect the most fragile and vulnerable of all human life, namely the unborn child, continues on the state level, including here in Oregon.

While the Church has done so much to help women and men heal from abortion, provide support to women who choose life, offer love and compassion to former abortion workers, and address the reasons why women seek abortions and offer meaningful alternatives, we cannot count that as enough. We must not rest in our efforts until the day no one chooses to pursue an abortion. The mercy of God knows no bounds, for both the unborn child and those women and men who have sadly experienced the tragedy of abortion in their own lives. I pray for the profound healing only Jesus can bring.

While this announcement may come with a profound sense of victory for us as Catholics, I must remind you it may bring a sense of anger and confusion for others. The truth is, these people have been deceived. It is precisely now that we must show them we are the people of hope and forgiveness. It is not a time for triumphalism - it is a time for gratitude, and for mercy.

### ***On June 15, Archbishop Sample released the following change in **The Age of Confirmation in the Archdiocese of Portland.*****

*For several years, a number of our priests and laity have requested reconsideration of the age of Confirmation in the Archdiocese of Portland. Among the reasons that motivated this request were the desire that our youth receive the gift of the Holy Spirit as they transitioned through adolescence into adulthood, the opportunity for recipients to exercise the graces of Confirmation through meaningful Christian ministry during their high school years, and to ensure an increase in confirmed Catholics.*

*From a pastoral perspective, there was also the need to correct the erroneous perception that Confirmation is tantamount to graduation and the concept that Confirmation was a personal choice of the candidate, rather than the freely given gift of the Holy Spirit who desires all the Baptized to share actively in the Paschal Mystery as authentic witnesses of Jesus in the world.*

*The Presbyteral Council voted unanimously to recommend that Confirmation be moved from high school age to seventh grade (12-13 years)*

*After much prayer and research, discussion and dialogue, and in collaboration with the Presbyteral Council, I formally amend 9.8.6 of the current Confirmation Policy (Chapter 9 of the Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook) to state: In the Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon, young Catholics who were baptized as infants are confirmed in the 7th grade year of middle school. This amendment will begin October 1, 2022 and transition will be completed no later than December 31, 2025.*
