Fr. Paul's Message



All things work together for good. – Manifest (TV program, NBC & Netflix)
We know that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. – Romans 8:28 – the actual text from the Bible

Same difference. You know what they meant. Well, not really. Proof texting, taking a quote out of context may help your Sci-fi TV show, but it loses the actual meaning of the scripture, a real relationship with God.

What is good? Who is God? What is "His" purpose?

I think we would like to believe that all these things are mysterious, by that I mean, without answer. We go in search of meaning and purpose in life. Privileged few take "gap" years, go on "walkabout", really "Eat, Pray, Love," in some foreign location to find one's self, one's purpose. If you are reading this, you are most likely Catholic, and just so you know, a pilgrimage is not a self-help journey, it is an offering to God, we don't do all that self-discovery of who we are mumbo jumbo.

The Paschal Mystery, the Roman Catholic Faith, The Way, The Truth, and The Life has an answer. Yes, it's Jesus Christ, but maybe I should expound on that. I like the old Baltimore Catechism because it's pretty succinct when it comes this stuff.

- 1. Who made the world?
- God made the world.
- 2. Who is God?

God is the Creator of heaven and earth, and of all things.

3. What is man?

Man is a creature composed of body and soul, and made to the image and likeness of God.

4. Why did God make you?

God made me to know Him, to love Him, and to serve Him in this world, and to be happy with Him forever in the next.

So, what's my purpose? To make God known, loved, and served. God help us, that's it. Not too complicated. Best yet, God is going to make "manifest" this. Just commit, or like local corporate mega-giant Nike says "Just do it."

I'll leave you with an old favorite of mine. Because maybe "Just do it" or the Baltimore Catechism isn't "doing it" for you.

"Until one is committed, there is hesitancy, the chance to draw back, always ineffectiveness. Concerning all acts of initiative and creation, there is one elementary truth the ignorance of which kills countless ideas and splendid plans: that the moment one definitely commits oneself, then providence moves too.

All sorts of things occur to help one that would never otherwise have occurred. A whole stream of events issues from the decision, raising in one's favour all manner of unforeseen incidents, meetings and material assistance which no man could have dreamed would have come his way. I have learned a deep respect for one of Goethe's couplets:

Whatever you can do or dream you can, begin it. Boldness has genius, power and magic in it. Begin it now."— William Hutchison Murray, The Scottish Himalayan Expedition
