

HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE:

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well


as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council www.svdppdx.org. Meetings take place in the Rectory on the second and fourth Tuesdays of every month at 6:30 PM and by Zoom. All parishioners are invited, and volunteers are encouraged to attend. 





Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

There is an African proverb with which we are all familiar: It takes a village to raise a child. As I reflect on the pending 8th grade graduation for the Holy Redeemer School Class of 2022, it occurs to me that many people have had some role in

educating and shaping the lives of these young people.

I don't know about you, but I remember all of my grade school teachers. I was taught by Franciscan nuns and a few truly dedicated lay people. After my parents, they played a huge role in my life on a daily basis. I am sure that if we were to ask them, that our 8th grade students would single out their teachers as having had the greatest impact on their lives since they first entered the hallowed halls of Holy Redeemer School. I wish to salute all of those teachers who helped guide our students to this milestone event in their young lives. What they have done for so many students is a labor of love that flows from their vocation and calling as teachers.

Apart from the teachers, so many others have played a role in supporting their day-to-day experience as students. A school, after all, is like an aircraft carrier in a fleet of ships: it takes a great number of people to run it. From the Principal and administrative staff, to those who work in the cafeteria or in maintenance, we could not have a more committed bunch working together under one roof.

I also think that our 8th graders would feel grateful for the friends they have made while at Holy Redeemer. How blest are any of us to find true friends who are there for us day after day, no matter what. In the words of Woodrow Wilson, "Friendship is the only cement that will ever hold the world together."

Our 8th graders have had to endure just over two years of a pandemic, where for long stretches of time they could not be with their teachers and classmates in person. It sometimes made them feel sad and lonely but thankfully they can soon graduate in a more normal way.

As Pastor, I have been privileged to serve these students on a more spiritual plane. Each of them has shown me something of the face of God. I have always felt closest to them while praying together at Mass, when we have come together as a family of faith, listening to the word of God, hearing sacred music sung by our angelic sounding student choir, and receiving Christ at the altar, all the while perceiving his presence in one another.

I pray for all of our 8th graders as they prepare to graduate. May the education they have received at Holy Redeemer School prove to be foundational as they continue to develop their God-given talents, and eventually put them at the service of others. May they always find people of good will to support, encourage, and guide them in their lives, until such time as they become the ones shaping the lives of others for the better.
