The Feast of *Corpus Christi* is a special time where Catholics throughout the world share and publicly express their love of the Holy Eucharist.

HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE:

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners



as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by

the Portland District Council www.svdppdx.org. Meetings take place in the Rectory on the second and fourth Tuesdays of every month at 6:30pm and by Zoom. PANTRY NEWS: For the month of May, our SVDP pantry was able to provide over 3,500 pounds of food to 85 families, and over \$1,400 in rent and utility assistance. Thank you, Holy Redeemer!



Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

As we approach the end of the school year and summer is now upon us, I wanted to give you a brief update on some pending departures of personnel from our parish and school. I also wanted to let you know something about the Holy Cross General Chapter that I will soon be attending in Rome.

Parish Staff Departures. As you are aware, Meaghen Igloria has just completed a three-year period of service as our D.R.E. Meaghen did a superb job preparing our children for their sacraments, introducing innovative approaches to religious formation,

and fully engaging parents as the first teachers in the faith for their children. Most impressive was her ability to keep meeting with children during Covid while having to observe the strictest of protocols. I cannot say enough about her ability, especially during all the racial unrest we experienced as a nation, to post timely and relevant church resources on the parish Facebook and Instagram accounts.
