PRIESTLY ORDINATIONS

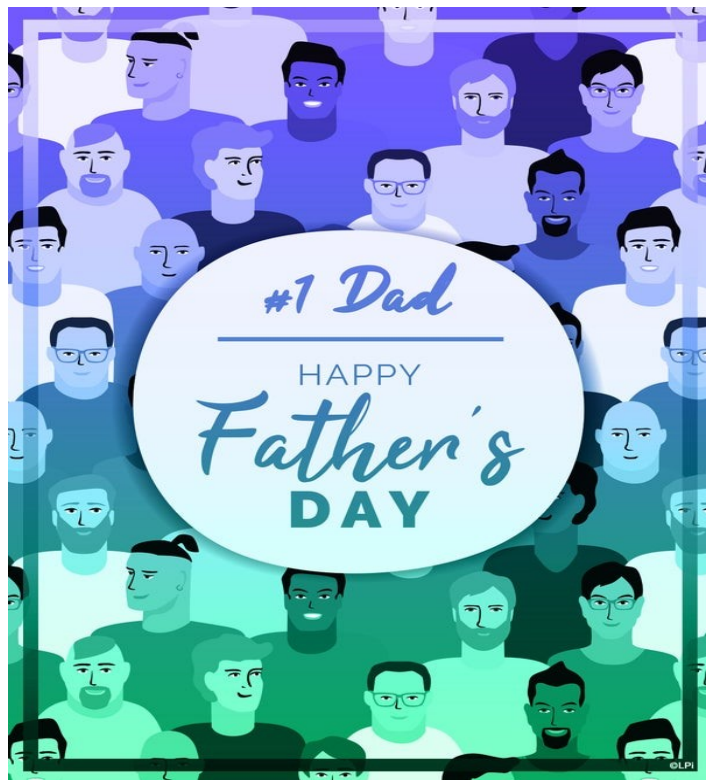

Pastor's Message

Dear good people of Holy Redeemer,

People are funny. When I greet people on December 25, "Merry Christmas!" people say, "Same to you, Father." When I wish people "Happy Easter!" they respond, "Same to you Father." And, believe it or not, even on Mother's Day, when I say "Happy Mother's Day!" some people reply, "Same to you Father." Funny, right? So, today, as our nation honors all Dads this weekend, let me thank you in advance for your Father's Day greeting: "Same to you Father."

As priests, we sometimes talk among ourselves how strange it is to be called "Father." One time, a woman asked me, knowing that I was Roman Catholic priest, if I had any children. And I responded, "Yes, I have a lot of children. Too many to count!" And even though I don't change diapers or go to Little League games or worry about teen-agers who just got their Oregon DMV Learner's permits, the reality is that, as an ordained minister with the title, "Father," I understand that I am meant to serve everyone as a father, helping people to find their way, spending time to be with those who are in need, offering counsel and advice, offering the graces of the Sacraments, helping other in prayer, speaking the truth of the Gospel, even when it is difficult. In all things, to help others to experience the living presence of Christ in our lives as well as how much God, the Father of Jesus, loves every person.

In South Bend, a few years ago, I had a meeting at City Hall, with the mayor, Pete Buttegieg, whose father had died recently. In fact, Pete's father was one of my professors in college. At the end of the meeting, as I left his office, Mayor Pete needed to get my attention and he called out "Father!" I can't tell you what it felt like to have this accomplished young man address me in this way. I felt honored.

Among priests, it's even more curious we find, to have people other than ourselves call us "Father". Again, the reality for us Catholics is that no matter the age of the priest or those who call upon him, he is meant to serve others in such a way that they know the goodness of God as Father and realize they are God's cherished children.

So, let's thank the Lord for our dads. And, just so you know, next Sunday at the 8am Mass, a new Father will be visiting us- Tony Galati, who was ordained by Archbishop Sample on June 26th. Father Tony will serve at Holy Trinity in Beaverton but he will preside at the 8am Sunday Mass in thanksgiving at Holy Redeemer. He and his extended family have been part of Holy Redeemer for many years. If you can come, come to that Mass and give God thanks for all the gifts that God has given us, including a new priest.
