## HOLY REDEEMER SVDP CONFERENCE

As of 3/3/2021, we've served 76 families with \$6,530 in food/rent/utilities. Holy Redeemer church/school donated 258

lbs. of food and volunteers offered 49 hours of time. Thank you for your ongoing love and sacrifices.

#### **RENT & UTILITY ASSISTANCE**

We are able to provide emergency rent and utility assistance—for those facing utility cutoff or eviction. Assistance is provided to registered parishioners and households within our parish boundaries (N. Alberta to the Columbia River and N. Denver to NE 26th Ave.). We are able to provide this assistance due to the generosity of parishioners.

#### **EMERGENCY FOOD ASSISTANCE**

HR's SVDP Food Room (back side of church, basement level) is open every Wednesday and Saturday, 2:30 - 4:00 PM. Anyone in need of emergency food is encouraged to go to the food room during these hours of operation to be given emergency food. All requests are treated confidentially. ## Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

On Friday, March 26, at 6 p.m., we will celebrate *The Stations of the Cross in Atonement for Abuse and* 

for the Healing of All. These stations invite a wounded Church to contemplate the passion and death of Jesus through the experience of clerical abuse survivors. The titles of the 14 stations are Scripture-based, which is an alternative form of the stations that Pope John Paul II celebrated on occasion.

These stations were written by Fr. Paul Turner, and illustrated by Fr. Ron Raab, CSC (a Holy Cross priest), to foster healing amidst the destruction committed by their brother priests. Each station has powerful quotes from a victim/survivor's voice and is followed by a "Confessional Prayer of the Hierarchy."

We will livestream the Stations of the Cross that evening via Facebook Live. We will also project on a screen the powerful images that were painted by Fr. Ron Raab specifically for these stations. His intent in painting them was to juxtapose Jesus' face and children's handprints, evoking the destruction of innocence—both in children's lives and in Jesus' ministry.

Bishop William A. Wack, who is a member of the Congregation of Holy Cross and currently the Bishop of Pensacola-Tallahassee, Florida, wrote the following review about these stations: "In the face of the horror of abuse—especially by trusted church leaders—many ask, 'What can I do?' We are indeed the Body of Christ, and when one member has been hurt, we are all hurt. The Stations of the Cross in Atonement for Abuse and for the Healing of All provides the people of God with a way to join in a communion of prayer for our brothers and sisters who have been hurt and betrayed."

Please join us as we ask for God's healing grace for those most affected by this painful reality in our Church.
