# Father Michael's Message



Dear friends in Christ,

Today's Gospel for the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent is familiar to us: Luke 15:1-3, 11-32 "The Prodigal Son." But this parable is actually about more than the Prodigal Son, the younger son who took his inheritance from his father while his Dad was still living and went far and wide and spent his \$ on all sorts of dubious and probably self-destructive and sinful pleasures only to find that he was poor and hungry and ashamed and standing in a stinky pig sty even wishing he could eat their food. Whew!

This story is about a father. A father who had two sons. A father who had two sons and both sons were dead. Dead. Dead. But, glorious and amazing mystery, one of them begins to come back to life. From the realm of the dead, from the gray, gloomy place of loveless, lifeless, listlessness. Here's how ...

The elder son follows the rules, keeps his nose clean, does whatever his Dad wants and is unhappy, unmoved, unkind, and absolutely un-alive. Even though he does nothing wrong, his heart is not in the game and so he's Dead.

The younger son is self-centered and pleasure-seeking. He has the gall to ask for his inheritance before his Dad dies. Then, we know the story, he squanders his money, his energy, his love, his life. He is so selfish that he's dead to everyone else's needs. Even when he goes home to Dad and the farm, he's really only looking for food and a warm bed and a place to hang his hat.

Enter the Father! Dad! This guy loves both of his sons. He gives them whatever they need and even whatever they want. He is alive and lives for his boys. And when the younger son returns, much to the sniping snarkiness of the elder son, Dad tries to bring them together, to reconcile them, to bring them both in Life.

So, this story is about us. Each of us is both the elder son and the younger son. All of us can be self -serving, judgmental, ungiving, unkind, and unfeeling. But, it's through the love of the Father, the total forgiveness and his total acceptance that make us who we are.

You and I are God's sons and God's daughters. God fashioned us from the dust of the earth and recreated us through the life-giving water of the baptismal font and the gifts of the Spirit. During Lent, it's our task to face who we are - as composites of both sons - and return to the Father AND to be reconciled to those around us. It's no small task.

But this only happened though Jesus Christ and his death - on a Cross - and his resurrection - from the Tomb. I wonder how the Lord is trying to bring one of us back to life, right here, right now, during these days of Lent?
