
HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE












Fr. Michael's Message



HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY!

We celebrate the 6th Sunday of the Easter season; of the 50-day season, we have celebrated 36 days. Whew. Now, only two weeks until the Feast of Pentecost!

And as our nation honors Mothers today, perhaps it's also a good time to reflect upon motherhood and the Church. The Church is often referred to as a feminine entity: "Mother Church." This reveals a long-standing symbolism of God found in the Hebrew

Scriptures, the Bible that Jesus prayed and read and studied.

God is presented as creator, protector and guardian. God has married his beautiful bride: the people of Israel. The covenant God made with the people of Israel mirrored the love, fidelity and care that a husband is meant to have for his wife. And the tremendous image from the Hebrew Scriptures of heaven is tremendous! It's a wedding banquet, a feast where there's an abundant supply of the choicest foods and an ample sharing of delectable wines. Food and drink are steady supply for all to celebrate the wedding of God and His People and the marriage between heaven and earth! which overflows in abundance!

In our Christian tradition, we've carried that imagery over to the Church, which is the Bride of Jesus Christ the Bridegroom. So, the Church, comprised of men and women, boys and girls, saints and sinners, it is seen as Mother, that is, as a source of generative life. The Church's sons and daughters, adopted by Baptism and given the gifts of Word and Sacrament, are children of God and children of their Mother, the Church.

In offering Mass and the Sacrament of Reconciliation at a local men's prison, I am struck by how every inmate mentions his mother. They talk about their love for their Moms, how they've disappointed their Moms, and also how some of their Moms weren't the best examples or caregivers for them. Naturally, no person is perfect and no one's mother is perfect. But the relationship these men and all of us have with our mothers is significant because Moms are the first ones we see and who care for us in a most profound way.

My hope is that we treasure the joyful, precious memories of our Moms and we are open to forgiving them their faults and be understanding of their human weakness.

We can turn to Mary who is Mother of God and Mother of the Church and ask her maternal intercession through the Easter prayer: "Regina Caeli/Queen of Heaven"

Joy fill your heart, O Queen most high, alleluia!
Your Son who in the tomb did lie, alleluia!
Has risen as he did prophesy, alleluia!
Pray for us, Mother, when we die, alleluia!
