HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE:

"Giving help and hope, etc...." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that

it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council www.svdppdx.org. Meetings take place in the Rectory on the second and fourth Tuesdays of every month at 6:30 PM and by Zoom. All parishioners are invited, and volunteers are encouraged to attend. Pastor's Message

"Many people nowadays say, 'I wish I could see his shape, his appearance, his clothes, his sandals." Only look! You see him! You touch him! You eat him!" St. John Chrysostom

"Out of the darkness of my life, so much frustrated, I put before you the one great thing to love on earth: the Blessed Sacrament ... There you will find romance, glory, honor, fidelity, and the true way of all your loves upon earth." J. R. R . Tolkien

Dear Friends:

I wanted to share with you these two wonderful quotes on the occasion of our young parishioners who are making their First Communion this Sunday, May 15, at the 10 a.m. Mass.

My greatest wish for each of them is that they will understand who it is that they are receiving in their hands. They are receiving Christ himself. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us, at Communion you see him, touch him, and eat him. What other opportunity is presented to human beings that offers such intimate contact with God?

I hope that these young people will always hunger for Christ and learn to seek him, love him, and follow him. I want them to know that Christ will never fail nor forsake them. He is a friend who will be faithful to the end. He alone can satisfy the deepest hunger of the human soul, which is the hunger for God. I chose the above quote from J.R.R. Tolkien not only because of my love for *The Lord of the Rings*, but because I discovered that Tolkien himself went to daily Mass, which he prized above all other things.

In his letter to his son, he suggests that the only thing that got him through the periods of darkness and frustration was the Blessed Sacrament. He calls it the one great thing to love on earth.

I hope that our young people can discover, when they are feeling lonely, sad, or afraid, that receiving Christ in Communion will give them inner light, strength, and peace. If the Blessed Sacrament becomes the one great thing they love on earth, then they will have discovered the true wellspring of happiness.

I also pray that they can perceive Christ within themselves and in every human being they encounter. We are, after all, one body in Christ.

I rejoice whenever I meet young people filled with a genuine faith in Christ. May their First Communion light a fire of faith and joy within them that will never be extinguished!
