



Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

There are two months when the Catholic Church traditionally honors Mary: the month of May and the month of October. This coming Friday our first-grade students will participate in the traditional May Crowning of Mary at the school Mass. They will come with fresh flowers

and surely be excited to come in procession and place them one by one before her statue.

In my own home, I would not say that we had much by way of Marian devotion, though we always had a small statue of Mary above a hutch in our dining room. I learned to pray the rosary when I was about 16 and my best friend's mother was dying. He and I started praying the rosary together after someone explained to us how to pray it.

My favorite place of all that honors Mary is the Grotto at Notre Dame. In 1878, Fr. Edward Sorin, the founder of Notre Dame, had a replica of the Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes built on campus. Some say it is the closest replica they have ever seen of the original Grotto in France.

The rosary has been prayed there every day at 6:45 p.m. since time immemorial, come rain or snow. There are racks of devotional candles always burning, and tradition says that when you take a wick to light your candle, you should light it from a candle that is about to burn out. That way you join someone's prayer to yours and keep it going.

It is a place very popular with students who can be found praying there at all hours of the night (especially during final exams) or for people to visit during a crisis or some kind of personal loss.

I remember one gentleman stopping by my office in Campus Ministry one day. He told me that his daughter had just died of cancer, and he drove to Notre Dame to find some solace at the Grotto. As he knelt there at night, a Notre Dame student knelt down not far from him. She started to sob and he asked if she wanted to talk. It turned out that her father had just died unexpectedly. As they talked about their mutual loss, he said, "It seems like you need a father right now and I need a daughter," and they embraced. He spoke of it as something of a miraculous and healing encounter. He gave Mother Mary all the credit.

I share this because the Grotto helped me to develop a friendship with Mary that did not really exist before. I cannot say that I pray the rosary as often as I should, but when I think of all the holy women who have shaped my life of faith, isn't it just possible that Mary herself seeks out friendship with people who love her son?

While we cannot sit and have a cup of coffee or a glass of wine with Mary, I suspect an occasional rosary connects us more intimately to this amazing woman than we dare believe. In addition, since Jesus cannot say "no" to his mother, there is no telling what can happen when we ask for her intercession before her son!
