

## **HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE:**

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in

that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council <a href="www.svdppdx.org">www.svdppdx.org</a>. Meetings take place in the Rectory on the second and fourth Tuesdays of every month at 6:30 PM and by Zoom. All parishioners are invited, and volunteers are encouraged to attend. 

# Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

I thought that it might be helpful to offer you a few updates on things parish-related as we approach the latter part of May and the end of the school year isn't far off.

Assignments of Fr. Cameron, Fr. Michael, and Fr. Pat at Holy Redeemer. As most of you are aware by now, Fr. Cameron has been approved to serve for another year at Holy Redeemer Parish, which is great news indeed. Fr. Michael, who will complete a three-year term of service at the end of June has been renewed for another three years of service beginning July 1<sup>st</sup>, which is also very welcome news. Lastly, I will be beginning my fifth year of a six year assignment on July 1<sup>st</sup>. Usually after the first six years a pastor in Holy Cross is offered the possibility of an additional three years. So I hope to be here for the long haul if it be God's will. All three of us feel so blessed to be serving you and we truly enjoy our life together as brothers in our spacious rectory!

Two Seminarians Assigned to Holy Redeemer for the Summer. On May 26, Tyler Kreipke, a Holy Cross seminarian in his third year of vows, will be arriving at Holy Redeemer. Tyler is a convert to Catholicism. While getting his doctorate in engineering at Notre Dame he decided to become a Catholic, and upon completing his doctorate, decided to join Holy Cross. He is currently teaching part-time in the Department of Engineering at Notre Dame while he also pursues his Master of Divinity degree. He will be joined on May 27 by Joey Canepa, a seminarian from the Archdiocese of Portland who has finished his second year of pre-theology. He, too, is a convert to Catholicism who has a degree in engineering, and he is also a teacher. I suspect that the two of them will become fast friends. You will be seeing a lot of them around the parish and school. They will be with us until the end of July.

**Air Conditioning in the church.** Thanks to the generosity of a gift provided to the parish by Dick Safranski, we will be installing air conditioning in the church this summer! Given that we had one day that reached 116 degrees last summer, we are increasingly aware that hotter temperatures, due to climate change, will become more and more the norm. We are still working on getting quotes for the installation of three phase electrical wiring to the church. I will keep you updated as we do not have a specific date yet for the installation of the new A.C. units. But please thank Dick when you see him for his kindness to our parish.

Well, I guess that is enough excitement for one bulletin column. May God continue to richly bless Holy Redeemer Parish!
