Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

Part of me wishes I could step back in time to the early Church and witness the time when the Holy Spirit first descended upon the Apostles, or when it descended on a group of Gentiles while Peter was speaking to them.

What is clear is that it was a radically transformative and life-changing experience for all of them.

I think that many of us we would be hard-pressed to name a moment when we had a definitive and transformative encounter with the Holy Spirit. There is no doubt in my heart that the Holy Spirit has been at work in me and has touched others through my ministry as a priest. I just do not feel it that way some people do, I get a little jealous of those who speak movingly, and eloquently when they did directly feel the Spirit's touch.

I spoke the other day with a gentleman from Mexico who once found himself homeless and addicted as a young man who had just crossed the U.S. border into Southern California. After years of suffering, he found his way back to his Catholic faith, to sobriety through A.A., and to a particular life-changing encounter with a gentleman who asked him if he wanted to have a direct experience of Christ. What he shared with me seemed like something out of Acts of the Apostles.

When it comes to the Holy Spirit, I think it is good to be reminded that the Holy Spirit works invisibly through us in countless ways and that is a good thing because the human ego wants to coopt even spiritual power unto itself, which translates into spiritual pride. Better that I remain a humble instrument and let God's grace work through me unawares.

The other reality is that I still hunger for that more direct, powerful, and transformative encounter with the Holy Spirit. I think that most of us Catholics are less comfortable with the charismatic dimension of our faith. Yet part of me feels that our renewal as a Church depends greatly on a radical new experience of the Holy Spirit on par with what the early Christians experienced.

When I meet people who seemed to be directly attuned to the Holy Spirit, I find that many of them went through some experience of the cross that eventually provided an opening for the Holy Spirit to enter them and transform them.

So on this Pentecost Sunday, my prayer for you and for me is that we can witness in our lives what the first disciples did at Pentecost. We can continually invite the Holy Spirit to touch us anew, especially where we feel most weak and vulnerable, and patiently wait for our invitation to be accepted. If we are truly temples of the Holy Spirit, which we received at our baptism and confirmation, then it is more a matter of awakening to what has already been given to us.

Come, Holy Spirit!
