

HOLY REDEEMER PANDEMIC CHANGES

Due to the latest CDC Pandemic Guidelines and those of the Archdiocese:

- No Masses will require Sign Ups/Lottery to attend – just come and celebrate the Eucharist! There will be more pews open for seating at Mass.
- Anyone fully vaccinated will no longer be required to wear a mask.
- To maintain social distancing, the side pews are designated for anyone not vaccinated. Anyone not vaccinated, please continue to wear a mask.
- If some family members are not vaccinated, all members can sit in the side pews.
- June 6 is the last Sunday for Livestreaming on Facebook for the English and Spanish Masses.
- June 12 we will begin the Saturday 5:00pm Vigil Mass.
- Once we no longer need to sanitize the pews, we will reinstate our 3:30pm Saturday time for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Until then, please continue to contact Fr. Pat and Fr. Michael to schedule a time to meet with one of them.

Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

Pope Francis once said, "God reveals himself through surprises." I can remember my Provincial asking me if I might be interested in running our seminary in Nairobi, Kenya. That one caught me completely by

surprise. However, what surprised me even more was that something deep within me leapt at the prospect.

Usually the surprises that come our way in daily life are more garden variety. Still, if our eyes are open, we catch a glimpse of God's mysterious workings in the seemingly random happenings or encounters we experience.

A few Saturdays ago, I was invited to accompany some parishioners who regularly take food to some of the homeless encampments near our parish. They had invited some of the teenagers in the parish who are preparing for First Communion to accompany them and hoped that I might join them.

The first two sites we visited were near Delta Park. We met about 15 different people altogether. Most were single people though there were a few couples, as well. To my surprise, I met a young man from Uganda, where I once lived, and an older gentleman from Havana, Cuba, and we spoke together for a time in Spanish. The men and women we met were uniformly friendly, gracious, and faith-filled. How often we heard, "God bless you for this."

At another site in the Lloyd District, I actually met a Pastor who was homeless. He had been a captain in the Army and a successful businessman. I am not sure what led him to be homeless. He told me about his conversion to Christianity in Iraq while under heavy gunfire, and how he became very good friends with a Catholic priest at his assigned Army base. We talked shop for a time and then I asked him to offer a prayer of blessing over me. It was an amazing prayer and truly touched me.

I could also see our young people in action and how much they enjoyed the three hours we spent interacting with the individuals they met while serving them food.

So often, we can drive by such homeless encampments and simply see it as an eyesore and another sign of the sorry state of affairs in our country, but that is not how God sees things. We were actually visiting Christ in the distressing disguise of the homeless. Clearly, a number of the people we chatted with are suffering from mental illness. Despite that, there was an immediate bond of friendship, acceptance, and of love.

I was surprised by the joy I felt at having encountered these men and women who live on the streets. At the end of it, I realized that we all received so much more than we gave away by our simple gift of a hot meal on a Saturday afternoon.

We do follow a God who truly delights in surprising us!
