

Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

Happy Mother's Day to all of you moms out there! I want to thank all of you women who have given the gift of life and of love to your children. I think it is safe to say that we men have little understanding of what it is like to

be pregnant, to give birth, or to understand that special bond that is created in the process. Our hat is off to you.

I have to admit to being a momma's boy. I am the first-born child and the only son, with five amazing sisters that follow me. They do not seem to mind that my mother spoils me when I am home. I learned about what God's love is like from my mother. I knew that her love for me was unconditional. I remember as a tiny boy, if I was sad or upset, I could go find my mother wherever she was. She would take me in her arms, stroke my hair, and surround me with such tenderness, that whatever was bothering me would quickly dissolve.

Jesus clearly had a relationship with his mother that shaped him tremendously. Words cannot describe the kind of bond that existed between the two of them. They spent 30 years together in Nazareth before he set out on his three-year mission to the people of Israel. One can only wonder at what they talked about over so many years together. Clearly, God knew what he was doing when he sent the angel Gabriel to Mary, when she was only 15, to ask her be the mother of the Messiah.

Christ often emphasized qualities in God that were more traditionally maternal rather than masculine. When Christ weeps over Jerusalem, for example, he exclaims that he longed to gather her children to himself the way a mother hen gathers her chicks under her wings, but they refused.

The whole Bible is one story after another of the influence of holy mothers on their children. Even now, the power of a mother to shape the faith and values of her children is unquestioned. Motherhood is a profoundly challenging vocation in life, yet I cannot think of any vocation more important in our world.

I know that not everyone has had a positive experience of their mothers. Perhaps some mothers were too wounded to be effective in their role. Still, they managed to give the gift of life to their children, which is precious and enduring.

I especially want to pray for those moms who are currently with child and expect to deliver in the weeks and months ahead. We have a number in our parish. We are excited for you.

Above all, I want to give thanks for all of our mothers today, living and deceased. Because of them, we are here!
