We aim to provide 100 baskets to families and individuals within our parish boundaries. We could use your help: Please consider adding a few extra food items to your shopping cart to donate to a parish food drive. Each week between now and Christmas we will ask for donations of specific food types. This week we are **requesting canned meat and fish products**. Of course other canned/packaged foods are also welcome. You can bring your donations to the church vestibule around Mass times and to the rectory during office hours (Monday-Friday 8 a.m. to 3 p.m) or to the food pantry on Wednesdays or Saturdays between 2:30 and 4:00. Please mark the donations as "Christmas Food Baskets". Thank you for your generosity!

FOOD PANTRY NEEDS: coffee, tea, brown rice, 1# or 5# bags of sugar, juice, jam and box meals (like Hamburger Helper). You can bring these to the rectory or to the Food Room during Wednesday & Saturday hours.

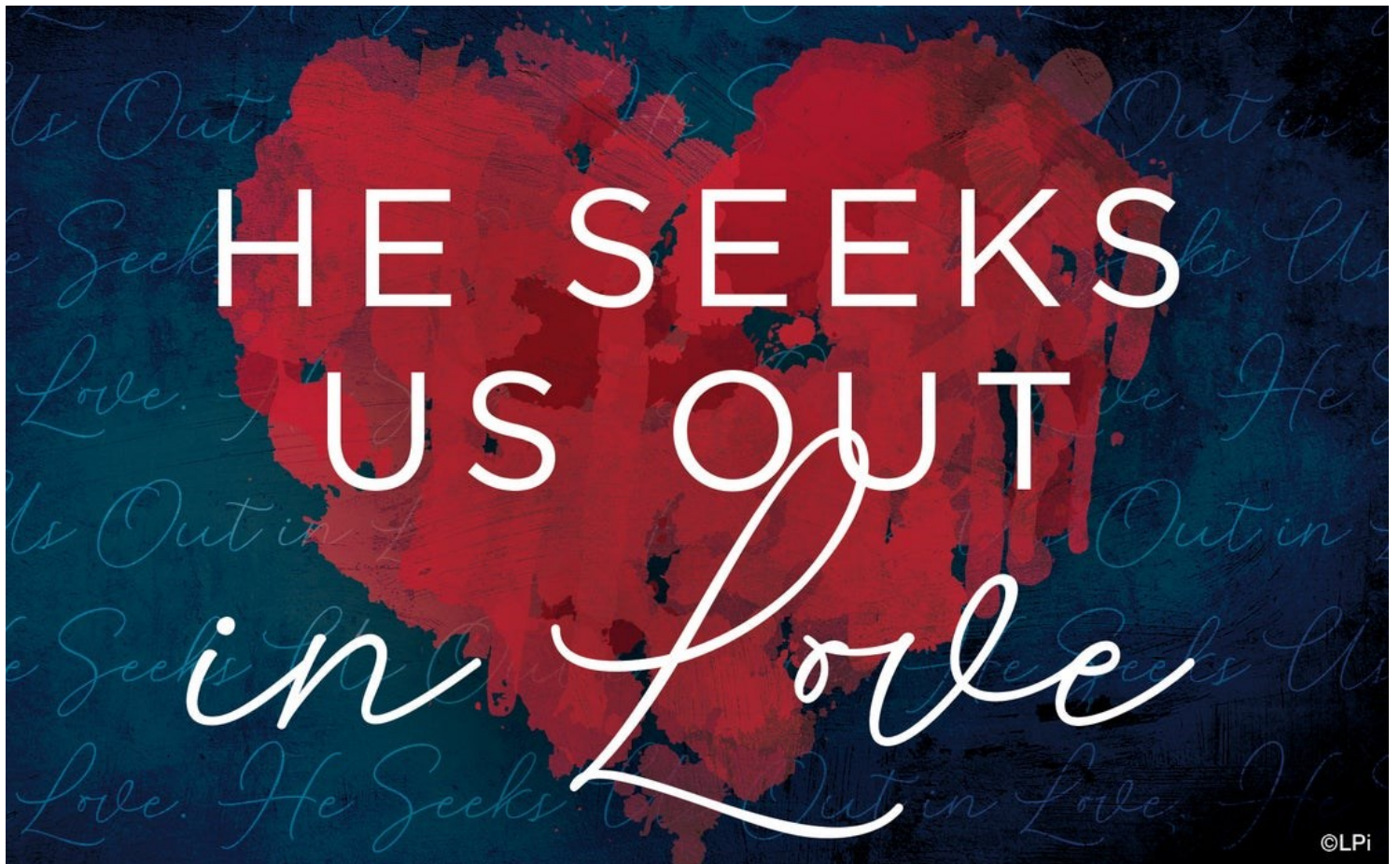

Dear Friends:

By now you have seen our special Altar of Remembrance in the church and the many photos of deceased loved ones that people have placed there. I have been particularly moved to see how many of you have put the names of deceased family members and friends on the cards of remembrance provided in the vestibule.

The longer I live, the more conscious I am of the people who touched my life but who are no longer on this earth. These are people who were lights for me, people who modeled faith, goodness, generosity, wisdom and compassion. Above all, they loved me and accepted me for who I was, despite my human shortcomings.
