
PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

VOCATIONS IN HOLY CROSS



The Feast of Christ the King was instituted in 1925 to address growing attitudes of secularism and atheism and to proclaim Christ's kingship forever. The day also marks the final Sunday on the Church's Liturgical Calendar.

Fr. Paul's Message





Dear Holy Redeemer,

"The ultimate weakness of violence is that it is a descending spiral, begetting the very thing it seeks to destroy. Instead of diminishing evil, it multiplies it. Through violence you may murder the liar, but you cannot murder the lie, nor establish the truth. Through violence you may murder the hater, but you do not murder hate. In fact, violence merely increases hate. So it goes. Returning violence for violence multiplies violence, adding deeper darkness to a night already devoid of stars. Darkness cannot drive out darkness: only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate: only love can do that." – Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The King will say to those on his right, "Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.

For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me."

Then the righteous will answer him and say, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink?

When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you?

When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?"

And the King will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." - Gospel of Matthew

Connecting these two quotes is the concept of *agape* or in other words, unconditional love. Christ the King has shown us the way to end all conflict, to bring about the kingdom of heaven, to be at peace with all. It is the cross, our only hope. It is self-sacrifice. It is the Christian journey to our homeland in heaven, paved in good deeds freely given, a risking of our very lives in service to one another. It is the Eucharist.

As we enter into this Advent Season you will hear us speak about the Mass and the real presence of the Body and Blood of Jesus. Be not mistaken, we are not interested in you becoming liturgical experts, or simply adherents to the truth of the Mass. We aim toward lived realities because the Eucharist is real. We aim not to simply sing or even attempt to grasp in concept the Paschal Mystery, we mean to live it as witnesses of the truth.

This requires real risk, real consequence, to make a world holy through self-offering. May we grow to mirror Christ the King more perfectly, as we receive grace upon grace in the Divine Liturgy. That we become what we receive and that light, that Eucharist, permeate all the we do and are. All through Christ our Lord.

Amen.
