## **RENT & UTILITY ASSISTANCE**

We currently are able to provide more emergency rent and utility assistance to persons who are facing utility cutoff or eviction, limited to once a year. Assistance is provided to persons/households within our parish boundaries (N. Alberta to the Columbia River and N. Denver to NE 26th Ave.). We are able to provide this assistance thanks to the generosity of parishioners, and recently with additional funds from a grant from the Oregon Community Foundation.

#### FOOD ROOM

Our SVDP Food Room is open Wednesdays and Saturdays 2:30-4:00pm. Anyone in need of emergency food is encouraged to visit us there for assistance; all requests are treated confidentially.

## **VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES**

We have openings for Wednesday, 2:15 - 4:15pm in the HR Food Pantry in the basement of the church. Volunteers work 2 hours once every 4 weeks.

During the COVID emergency, only volunteers work in the pantry packing boxes to give out to clients and their families. All volunteers are wearing masks and using gloves.

This is a great opportunity for HR parents and student children to work together and earn Fair Share Hours. Commitment is 2 hours every 4 weeks.



- Make the Sign of the Cross and say the Apostles' Creed
- Say the Our Father
- Say three Hail Marys
- Say the Glory Be
- 6 Announce the first mystery and then say the Our Father
- 6 Say 10 Hail Marys while meditating on the mystery
- Say the Glory Be (Optional: Say the O My Jesus prayer requested by Mary at Fatima)
- Announce the second mystery; then say the Our Father and repeat these steps as you continue through the remaining mysteries.
- 9. Say the Hail, Holy Queen
- 10. Make the Sign of the Cross





## Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

Blessed Basil Moreau, who founded the Congregation of Holy Cross in Le Mans, France, in 1837, was a man of vision and zeal who within fifteen years had established missions at Notre Dame, Indiana, New Orleans, Montreal, Canada, and East Bengal. Like so many founders of religious orders, however, he gained detractors over time. In the late 1850s, several influential members at a general chapter had him ousted as superior general over differences regarding what direction the congregation should take.

Forced to live apart from the community, he moved in with the Holy Cross sisters (known as the Marianites), but continued to preach retreats in the country parishes around Le Mans. Fr. Basil Moreau died on January 20, 1873, at the age of 74, without any trace of bitterness in his heart. I give credit to how Fr. Moreau understood the role of the cross in his life. In his own words, "For those who live by faith, the cross is a treasure more valuable than gold and precious stones."

In writing this, Fr. Moreau was in no way a spiritual masochist. He simply wished to communicate that whatever the suffering he experienced in his life, when he learned to surrender to it and to accept it, transformed him.

When I reflect on the scale of suffering brought about by the pandemic, and the killing of Black citizens by police, it seems fitting to look to the central symbol of spirituality in the West—the cross—for meaning. The cross teaches us that if a person can surrender to extreme limitation in whatever form it arrives, symbolized by Christ nailed to the cross, the worst thing that happens to you can be a doorway to transformation, transcendence, and freedom. As Fr. Moreau discovered, there is a grace hiding behind every form of suffering.

At the center of the sanctuary in our church hangs the cross of Christ, our Holy Redeemer. It is a constant reminder to surrender in faith to the worst thing that is happening to us right now. Jesus didn't find it easy to accept the cup of suffering that was given to him in Gethsemane nor will we. In time, we will see how even the cross can be born as a gift, and when accepted, is a treasure more valuable than gold and precious stones.
