Guest speaker and dinner (\$95 per person) at 7:30pm follows. Rev. Tadeusz Pacholczyk, Ph.D., a priest of the Diocese of Fall River, Massachusetts, earned his doctorate in neuroscience from Yale and did postdoctoral work at Harvard. Currently, he serves as the Director of Education at The National Catholic Bioethics Center in Philadelphia and directs the Center's National Catholic Certification Program in Health Care Ethics.



HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility

assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council www.svdppdx.org. VOLUNTEERS FOR MONTHLY MEAL SERVICE AT ST. ANDRE BESSETTE DOWNTOWN

Our Holy Redeemer Conference of St. Vincent de Paul will again be providing a monthly meal service at St. Andre Bessette downtown, in their commercial kitchen. The time commitment is typically less than 4 hours a month and Holy Redeemer Catholic School Fair Share Hours are available to school families that participate.

Holy Redeemer will be hosting the second Fridays of the month, starting in October and our goal is to form a team of about 8 volunteers. Anyone with experience in restaurants/food carts to help coordinate the preparation, packaging and distribution of the to-go meals would be very appreciated.

The Pastor of St. Andre Bessette will provide an orientation for our volunteers on our first Friday and will explain any safety concerns to help everyone feel confident and assured that clients can be served with dignity and respect. Volunteers will need to be comfortable with using stairs in the work space.

Work starts with the meal preparation 3:00- 4:00pm followed by serving the meal and then of course clean up. At this point, the meals are boxed "to-go" with hopes of moving to "stay and eat "dining room service in the future.

SOUP 'N' SUCH Saturday October 29th, 6:15pm:



Fr. Michael's Message



"Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life." (Romans 6:3-4)

Question: Is Baptism for infant or adults? What do you think? How would you answer? **The answer is**: Both! And so we, as a Church, baptize adults AND we baptize infants.

Infants

The Church uses the word "children" or "infants" for those who haven't reached the age of discretion, typically 6 or 7 years old, and aren't able to profess the faith on their own. for themselves. A child can't make life choices and doesn't have sufficient development to make responsible moral decisions. Of course, we recognize that a 7-year-old isn't the same as a 17-year-old or a 77-year-old. But this is the way the Church designates Baptism. Any instruction and teaching for Sacraments takes into account the age and ability of the one who is a candidate for Baptism.

Infants/children under the age of 7 are baptized on the extension of the faith of their Catholic parent/parents. Children can't make such decisions and aren't responsible for it. However, parents do and so provide every good thing for their children, including introducing them to Jesus and the Way of faith as a Catholic Christian

<u>Adults</u>

Those who are 7 years and older are taken into the **R**ite of **C**hristian **I**nitiation of **A**dults, whose acronym is **RCIA**. This is a process by which, tailored to the needs of the candidates, they learn how to pray, they discern what the Lord is asking of them, they reflect upon the Scriptures, they come to Mass and involve themselves in other Christian activities of prayer and service, as they make their way to the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. RCIA is the norm for initiation into the Church for those who are not infants.

Godparent/Sponsor

Both sacramental celebrations need a Sponsor also known as Godparent. Godparents have no legal obligation to those whom they sponsor, but they're called to represent the wider Church community, be a witness to the Faith, a partner in prayer, and help the person on their journey toward the Kingdom. For godparents of infants, their task is to assist parents to raise their children in the Faith since parents have that primary role.

Given the role of public witness that godparents share, they must: 1. Be 16 years old or older, 2. Be initiated with the three sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist and living out their faith. 3. If married, they need to have been married in the Church so as to remain in communion with the Church.

Living out our Baptism is a daily challenge and joyful adventure, both as children and as adults. Sharing in another's baptism as a Godparent or Sponsor is a real gift. But together, we always live out our Faith in Jesus Christ and give witness to the Gospel by all that we say and do. Alleluia!
